





Ranching In The

A highly diversified Colorado breeder focuses on beef production under challenging environmental conditions.

T-Heart Ranch, located high in the rugged mountain terrain of south-central

located high in the rugged mountain terrain of south-central Colorado near the small town of Center, didn't even exist 20 years ago. Today, owners Shane and Beth Temple, run a cowherd of 2,000 head, market 100-125 bulls and sell 500-600 bred commercial replacement heifers annually.

Along the way, the Temples have become a primary source for high altitude seed stock, carving out a market with those breeders who need genetics that can tolerate deadly brisket disease, often associated with grazing up to timberline at 11,000 feet or higher.

On the Fast Track

"After high school, I went to Lamar Community College for a year, but I was impatient and wanted to get started ranching sooner than later," Shane recalled. "So I came back home to this area and took a job on a ranch for a couple of years."

In 1995, armed with a first-time farmer loan, he bought 30 cows, plus a small piece of land. "I'd always had a passion for cattle, having

grown up around my grandfather's small herd of Hereford-Angus cross cows," he commented.

Shortly thereafter, Shane and Beth were married. "I guess you could say that we started with nothing. We had met in high school and she's my full-time partner — committed 100% to our operation. She's the mother of our four children, serves as the ranch bookkeeper, and artificially inseminates 1,000 head every year with an amazing success rate," he says. Their children, three girls and a boy, are Shelby, 11; Lindsay, 9; Ashley, 4; and Coy, 1.

From that humble beginning, their operation has grown at an astonishing rate. "Those first cattle were just a mixed bunch that I wished we'd never bought. We acquired the wrong cattle and had to work our way through it. Later, we got involved with an outfit named 'Seedstock Plus,' which

focused on Gelbvieh, so we went with Gelbvieh for quite a while," he said.

"We had a lot of Angus-Gelbvieh crosses, but we were fighting so hard against brisket disease. We discovered that Angus have a low rate of tolerance to that problem," he reported. "So, after talking to Perry McKinley, a good friend and partner on some cattle from Oklahoma, we introduced Simmental into our breeding program. When I saw those first Simmental-sired calves, I knew we were on to something."

He's very pleased with the Simmental influence. "By putting Simmental in there, it has taken our brisket disease death loss down to almost nothing. Phenotypically, Simmental are just good cattle to be around, pleasant to look at, structurally sound. The breed has a tremendous number of good cowmen who have developed the breed and put together good, hardy cattle," he continued.

He's also convinced his folks, Danny and Denise, to introduce Simmental into their 300-head cowherd. "My dad had been involved in the landscaping business when I was growing up and didn't get into cattle until I did. Now, he's raising cows full time," he explained.

The Temples have drastically expanded their land base by acquiring nearby ranches as they became available. In 2005, they bought a 1,000-acre place that adjoined their original small acquisition. Three years ago, they bought the famed L-Cross Ranch, which enabled them to expand their carrying capacity by 800 head. They now own 10,000 deeded acres and have access to Bureau of Land Management, state and private leases totaling nearly 80,000 acres.

The current cowherd includes 500 registered cows, both Angus and SimAngus™, split almost 50-50. Their large commercial herd is comprised largely of Angus-cross females, with a 200-head Hereford contingent, acquired during their most recent ranch acquisition. "You can see that we've got a little bit of everything in there, but my ultimate goal is to turn the entire commercial herd into SimAngus," he went on.

"On the purebred side, our goal is to reach the purebred Simmental level. We're already breeding our halfbloods to purebreds to produce three-quarter females, and as soon as those replacements are ready, we'll breed them to purebreds," he said. "We'll A.I. those Simmental females, because of their resistance to brisket disease, to Angus bulls."

At such high elevations, the grazing season is short, necessitating a feeding period of seven months or longer. One way they have managed to maintain and increase herd size is by utilizing readily available by-products, such as potatoes and straw to make silage that serves as a big part of their winter feed supply.

For the past two years, 800 head have been trucked 300 miles to the Texas Panhandle, where they graze cornstalks and milo stubble. "We hope to continue to take advantage of that available feed between October and mid-February." He also runs cattle on a lease on the nearby Baca Federal Wildlife Reserve from October through December.

A crew of seven men is needed to handle the workload at T-Heart and L-Cross. "One of the most challenging things I have to do is managing help. We provide a house, pay the utilities and give my main guys a beef each year," he says.

They are members of Allied Genetics Resources, owned by former ASA Director of Commercial Programs Marty Ropp. "Marty offers sound advice, helps with our promotion, and is heavily involved in managing our sale. Last year our bulls sold extremely well, averaging \$3,600," he said. "Four bulls went to well-known seedstock breeders, which kind of validates our breeding program.

The rest went to commercial producers."

Ropp is impressed with the Temples' work ethic and approach to beef production. "They are about as high tech and motivated to expand and get better as anybody I have met," he said.

Diversification

T-Heart Ranch currently produces 8,000 to 10,000 tons of hay annually, with a ready market of several area dairies. The hay is produced in large square bales under center pivot irrigation.


Temple has a contract for malt barley production with the famed Coors Brewing Company, also under irrigation. The contract calls for two million pounds a year, and he also leases farm ground from Coors.

In recent years, more and more embryo transfer has been incorporated, flushing their own cows and placing 150 embryos this past year into some of their commercial cows. "We still have 80 Balancer females and used them as recipients. We are in the process of phasing out the Balancers, but they make very good recips," he said.


Before bulls are sold, they go through a rigorous on-ranch development program. Former ASA Board Chairman Robert Campbell, Ignacio, Colorado, has placed bulls in the T-Heart development lot for past four years. "Robert markets his bulls right along with ours," he added. Bulls sell through a sale held at the sale barn in Monte Vista, a short 18-mile trip from the ranch.

Bred replacement heifers are in great demand. "We're selling Sim-Angus-influenced heifers and eventually we'll be selling 100% SimAngus heifers. That's a great market for us — we sold our last batch through Superior Livestock Video, averaged \$2,250. We ultra-sound and fetal-sex those heifers which also draws extra interest," he reported.

PAP Testing Vital At High Altitudes

High Mountain Disease (HMD), also known as Brisket Disease or Dropsy, is a very costly malady. It is the result of elevated pulmonary arterial pressure caused from lack of oxygen and generally affects animals at elevations above 5,000 feet. Some cattle are able to tolerate high pressures for a long period of time while others die quickly. HMD is not limited to one sex or to one breed.

Pulmonary arterial pressures (PAP) scores are obtained through a procedure known as "right-heart-catheterization." A fine plastic catheter is passed through a needle in the jugular vein, with blood flow into the upper right side of the heart, through a valve into the right ventricle, through another valve, and into the pulmonary artery just short of the branches to the lungs. Pressure waves are observed on a heart monitor, which gives a direct readout of the true average pressure.

Tim Holt, DVM, an assistant professor at Colorado State University's Veterinary Hospital is a recognized world expert on HMD, and also maintains a private veterinary practice. "This disease is stimulated by hypoxic stress secondary to high altitude. Therefore, it is impossible to conduct accurate PAP tests in lower elevations," Holt explained. Cattle tested at lower elevations, regardless of how low the scores were, have developed HMD or scored a high PAP test when taken to high elevation. The higher the elevation when the test is taken, the more accurate.

Research has shown that heritability of HMD is quite high, ranging from 42% to 84%, indicating that cattlemen can successfully select against the disease by culling cattle with high PAP scores.

T-Heart Ranch has distinguished itself in many ways, but specializes in supplying low PAP bulls for ranchers who run cattle in the higher elevations of the West. T-Heart Ranch was among the first to conduct wholesale testing at such high altitudes and have evaluated more than 4,500 bulls over the last decade. "Our bull development lot, at 7,700 feet is the highest elevation of any in the US," owner Shane Temple said.

Simmental Genetic Trends (1993-2013)

As we look to rebuild our cattle inventory and increase food resources for the mushrooming population growth, it's an important time to review genetic trends of the Simmental breed. In the February 2014 edition of BEEF, a survey asked a group of producers, "What was the breed makeup of the last bull(s) you purchased?" The top five breeds were Angus, Hereford, Red Angus, Simmental, and SimAngus[™] (66.8, 17.2, 11.9, 8.8, and 8.1%, respectively). If we consider Simmental and SimAngus together, we rank third in the poll (16.9%). The percentage Simmental and SimAngus increased from the 2010 BEEF poll with only 4.6 and 5.5% respondents buying Simmental and SimAngus, respectively. According to the NAAB website (12/3/2013), the top five beef breeds for semen sales in 2012 were Angus, Simmental, Red Angus, Polled Hereford, and Gelbvieh (74.1, 8.4, 6.0, 3.9, and 1.3%, respectively). It is comforting to see that SimGenetics are competitive in the market but we certainly have room to grow. Simmental cattle have improved in a number of economically important traits

Yearling Weight (YW), Carcass Weight (CW), Yield Grade (YG), Marbling (MRB), Back Fat (BF), Ribeye area (REA), and Shear Force (SF). As you can see, the myth that Simmental cattle are hard calvers is not true with today's genetics. We have increased our direct calving ease from 1.8 to 9.2 %. We have also made progress in maternal calving ease and stayability while continuing to improve our growth and performance traits. Simmental cattle are known for producing desirable yield grade scores but we have also made huge progress in the marbling ability of our cattle (from -0.12 in 1993 to 0.12 in 2013).

For those of you who are more visual thinkers, here are two graphs to illustrate Simmental genetics are moving in the right direction. In Figure 1, you can see changes in a number of important traits in purebred Simmentals born in 1994 to 2013. Please note, the graph is not in actual EPD units. Rather, each trait has been standardized (divided by the standard deviation and set the 1994 EPD value to zero) so comparisons of relative changes among the nine EPDs can be made. Again, you


over the years leading to the current population offering high-quality genetics to an industry needing to bolster numbers and efficiency of cattle. There are many myths about Simmental cattle that hopefully can be dispelled by reviewing the following data.

The tables below provide the average EPD values for purebred Simmental cattle born in 1993, 2003, and 2013 for the following traits: Calving Ease (CE), Birth Weight (BW), Maternal Calving Ease (MCE), Stayability (STAY), Mature Weight (MW), Maternal Weaning Weight (MWW), Docility (DOC), Weaning Weight (WW),

can see that Simmental cattle have made improvements in each of these traits over the last 20 years especially in marbling and calving ease. The selection pressure in these economically relevant traits is reflected in the increase in the selection indices (API and TI; Figure 2) over the same time period. The average API has grown from roughly \$58 to \$118/exposure. While TI has not increased as sharply as API, TI has still improved from roughly \$53 to \$68/exposure in the last 20 years. This translates to an increase of \$60.40 and \$14.80 per cow exposed for API and TI, respectively.

The time is here to sell our story. These data showcase the high-quality genetics Simmental cattle have to offer. The industry is looking to expand and Simmental breeders, through wise selection, have built a product that can improve the efficiency, meat quality, and profitability of beef production. Simmental breeders should be proud of the progress they have made over the last 20 years. Keep up the good work!







Stalling information will be available following the close of entries. Please be sure to use a current email address when submitting your Classic entries, as you will receive email confirmations and stalling details.



Parnell Investigates ASA Technology



Howdy Everyone! I hope that by the time you receive this issue of the Register the weather is turning nicer and the polar vortex is over! This has been a challenging winter to say the least. Much of the country has seen significantly below normal temperatures and above average snow fall. It even got nasty enough outside to shut down the city of Atlanta! I hope that calving season went well for you during those bad weather stretches if you happened to be calving at that time. It not only is added stress to the cattle and calves when having to deal with bad weather, but also the people taking care of them. It can especially be difficult on the dynamics of the family unit. I hope you were able to make it through those bad weather stretches with family relationships left intact.

I would like to visit with you this month a little bit about something that relates to calving season and getting through calving season with a healthy calf crop and cowherd. As seedstock producers, many times we tend to focus on making genetic improvement and the genetic value of an animal. Obviously this is important to make improvement in our cattle and their overall quality. However, it is just as important, if not even more so that we pay attention to our health, nutrition, and welfare program in our cowherds. Whenever you purchase an animal you are also introducing that program's health management (or lack thereof) into your own cowherd. The same is true for people who purchase animals from you. Commercial producers especially place emphasis on these traits. For instance, if they purchase a bunch of heifers that don't conceive due to poor nutrition or health, they tend to not only have a bad experience with the person they purchased the animals from, but it also can reflect on the breed even though the problem resulted from something that had nothing to do with the genetics of the animals they bought.

The Simmental and SimAngus™ brand has improved so much over the past ten years. We have gained significant market share recently and it is not uncommon to hear about traditionally straight Angus commercial cowherds injecting Simmental in their breeding program to add much needed heterosis. Some of these people have not used Simmental for a long time or may never have utilized it in the past. Just like all first impressions, what tends to happen in these situations is they put the new breed that they are trying under the microscope and judge the value of the new breed that they are trying by their initial results and experiences. We are gaining more and more first-time Simmental customers every day and we want to make sure that they have a positive experience so they not only stay with Simmental, but also profess their good experience to friends, neighbors, and other cattlemen. This means that not only do we need to be cognizant of the genetic value of the cattle we sell to our customers, but just as critical is the soundness of your cattle's health and nutrition programs. My mother is a veterinarian so believe me when I say that every time my dad purchases a bull or a heifer we get lectured about disease risks,



and that animal gets isolated and tested for nearly every disease under the sun! I am sure many of you also work closely with your veterinarians and nutritionists and have a good health and nutrition program in place. Perhaps now would be a good time to check in again with them to see if it needs to be updated or any changes need to be made to what is currently done. If we have the best genetics in the world and there is an underlying health or nutrition problem in cattle, they do not get the opportunity to express their full and true genetic potential.

Spring is in the air and with it comes the feeling of new life and activity. We have many new projects happening at the ASA. We are continuing to work on a new educational website. This website will have links to online material in a variety of subject areas pertaining to beef production. Much of the material is developed by extension educators, teachers, and researchers from across the country. We have also developed some short videos to address key topics that concern our members like an introduction to key genetic principles and understanding selection indices. Another component of this website is a genetic glossary to help our readers and the public understand terms used when discussing Animal Breeding and Genetics. With new calves this spring, we fielded a few calls reporting unusual animals. This is not unexpected and in fact every calving season results in a few cases of calves born with something atypical. Growing up with a family-run veterinary clinic, seeing odd calves was just a part of calving season. The majority of these cases are caused by environmental stresses; but regardless we would like to document the conditions. We keep track of the information and use our consultants to understand the genetic threat or environmental issues that may explain the unusual calves. One struggle I have noticed this spring is in the follow through. Some of the producers I talked with this spring have not sent concrete information in to us. Without this information it is hard for us to move forward and report these cases. If you have an animal that you are concerned about, please contact me by email jatkins@simmgene.com or mail (c/o Jackie Atkins, 1 Simmental Way, Bozeman, MT 59715) with the following information: 1.) photos or video capturing unusual condition, 2.) a detailed description of the animal (including sex and birth date), and 3.) the name, registration number if applicable, and breed of the dam and sire. We send this information to a consulting pathologist and other research scientists to understand the cause of the condition. Based on their assessment, we may ask for DNA or other samples to study the condition further. The ASA also archives the information in case other similar reports arise in the future.

We have several other projects started which keep us on our toes and moving forward. Stay tuned to hear more on the latest developments in the ASA.

New, Free Program Designed to Reward and Incentivize Good Genetic and Management Practices

Feeder Profit Calculator

In an effort to better serve the commercial beef industry, International Genetic Solutions, and its

partners, have developed a tool used to determine relative value of feeder calves based on genetic, environmental and management factors. International Genetic Solutions is a cooperation of companies, such as breed associations, whose primary focus is the success of the commercial cattleman. The Feeder Profit Calculator will reward and incentivize better genetic and management practices.

What does the Feeder Profit Calculator do?

The calculator weighs all economic factors and

traits on a set of feeder calves according to how much money each factor will make a cattle buyer. The calculator is basically a breakeven calculator on steroids. It determines the overall quality of a set of calves and differentiates them from other calves. The calculator is able to adjust the value of calves based on market conditions that affect the cost of gain, value of feedlot calves, the live price of calves. The calculator weighs the genetic components of traits such as feed intake, growth, marbling, yield grade, and carcass weight as well as management and environmental factors such as the effects of vaccinations, weaning, deworming, and initial weight.

How is the Feeder Profit Calculator used?

The Feeder Profit Calculator is not a breeding index but instead rewards the use of good genetics and the use of breeding indexes as well as good management practices. The Feeder Profit Calculator is only meant to be used for marketing purposes.

The calculator can be used one of two ways. On large sales involving numerous producers or when used in a non-specific scenario, a "base" price will be established based on the current market information. Since the calculator is interactive, certain current industry conditions can be applied to the index to give potential buyers the most accurate value of the feeder calves available.

The other way the calculator will be used is to assist individual feedlots or cattle buyers using their specific scenario. A number of feedlots will use the calculator by inputting their specific production factors affecting cost of gain, live price, etc. With that information, these buyers will be able to determine how much a certain set of calves is worth to them specifically.

What units are the feeder calf values expressed in?

Cattle buyers, marketers and breed associations have been determining the value of groups of calves based on genetic and environmental merit for years. They have always expressed feeder calf value by the pound or per hundred-weight (cwt). The Feeder Profit Calculator will be no different and the value will be expressed per hundred-weight.

Is this an unbiased evaluation?

This evaluation is completely unbiased. The calculator is provided by a number of breed associations involved in International Genetic Solutions and is simply meant to reward and encourage good genetic and management practices. The calculator is available to all producers regardless of breed. Currently, the predictive ability of the index has the most value on Angus, Continental

cross calves. We also have the ability to predict the value of high-percentage British calves. In the near future we will have the ability to determine the value of straight-British calves.

Who is to credit for the Feeder Profit Calculator's development?

The development of the Feeder Profit Calculator would not have been possible without out such partners as Dr. David Lalman of Oklahoma State University, Dr. Mike MacNeil of the United States Department of Agriculture, CattleFax, and all of the partners of International Genetic Solutions and the Multi-Breed International Genetic Evaluation. Their time and effort has shown a true dedication to the improvement and success of the beef industry.

What is the cost of the Feeder Profit Calculator?

The Feeder Profit Calculator is currently free. It is provided as a service to the commercial industry by IGS and its partners in order to help improve practices in the industry. IGS does not intend to profit off the index but only wishes to see the genetic and management practices of the beef industry rise to new levels. In fact, IGS and its partners (universities, breeders) believe in this cause so much that they are willing to subsidize the program.

What information does a commercial cattleman need in order to use the calculator?

The producer will need to provide information on the sires of the calves and as much information as possible on the maternal grandsires of the calves. This information does not need to be on an individual animal basis but simply on a group basis. The producer will also need to provide information on management practices (or intended management practices).

When can a producer use the calculator?

Feeder calves can be run through the calculator long before sale time. As long as a producer has the necessary genetic information and has management decisions or intended management decisions established, the Feeder Profit Calculator can be used. If management factors change down the road, the values can be adjusted. The same holds true for changes in market conditions. Producers are encouraged to get genetic information in as early as possible.

How does a commercial producer run his feeder calves through the Feeder Profit Calculator?

Abnormal Calves Should be Reported

ASA members are encouraged and advised to report any abnormal calves born into their herds during the current calving season. ASA has a confidential, free reporting service for all members.

If you have an abnormal calf, please call Dr. Wade Shafer, or Dr. Jackie Atkins as soon as possible at 406-587-4541. ASA then works with each member to obtain a diagnosis. Regardless of whether or not the calf is alive or dead, it is imperative that ASA is notified before any tissue degradation occurs. It also helps if photos or video are available. If any laboratory work is needed, ASA pays all expenses.

BIF Headed for Lincoln

The Annual Meeting and Research Symposium of the Beef Improvement Federation (BIF) will be held June 18-21 at the Cornhusker Marriot Hotel in Lincoln, Nebraska. The event is being co-hosted by the University of Nebraska, the Nebraska Cattlemen's Association, and the Meat Animal Research Center.

An organization founded on standardized beef performance programs more than 45 years ago, the BIF represents more than 40 state and national beef cattle associations. Registrations are now being received and information is available at http://go.unl.edu/bif2014.

SDSU Studies Female's Energy Intake

Researchers at South Dakota State University are studying how changes to a beef cow's energy intake during the second trimester of pregnancy might affect her offspring's beef quality. Known as fetal programming, the concept suggests that during development of the fetus, important biological parameters can be manipulated.

The study showed that "altering maternal energy during mid-gestation impacts the fat deposition of the offspring" — calves from cows in a negative energy group had a more favorable distribution of carcass fat.

Plan Ahead When Submitting DNA Samples!

If you are sending in DNA samples for testing through ASA and GeneSeek, ASA's licensed lab, getting them in the mail sooner rather than later is ideal. GeneSeek starts one test run for ASA animals each week, and samples need to arrive by noon on Tuesday. The samples are then tested on Wednesday. If your sample arrives after noon Tuesday it will not start testing until the following week. Remember, paperwork generated by ASA must be sent with the samples. If you mail samples without paperwork your testing may be delayed and extra expenses incurred.

During the winter and spring, testing/reporting can take a little longer than the normal turnaround of 14-21 days, depending on what is being done. Plan ahead and get your sample(s) in at least six weeks before you absolutely need results. If you have any questions or concerns about DNA testing or sample(s) you have recently sent, please email dna@simmgene.com or call our office 406.587.4531.

SimGenetics in 16.9% of Bulls

According to a survey conducted by *BEEF* magazine, Simmental at 8.8% and SimAngus™ at 8.1% accounted for a combined 16.9% of bulls purchased by commercial breeders in the US.

The survey discovered that Angus still holds a firm hand on the beef industry, with 66.8% of the bull market. Hereford ranks second at 17.2%, followed by Red Angus at 11.9%. Strung out behind are Charolais (6.5%), Balancers (5.7%), Brangus (5.0%); Gelbvieh 4.5%; and Limousin at 2.7%. Numbers add up to more than 100% because some breeders have more than one breed and both breeds in a crossbreed are counted in a single animal. ◆



Government Sources "Most Reliable"

A Food Demand Survey, conducted in Oklahoma, asked consumers to rank 15 different sources for their trustworthiness about meat information. The US Department of Agriculture (USDA) and the Food and Drug Administration (FDA) ranked one-two, flying in the face of a popular anti-government trend that advocates for not "trusting anything the government stands for."

Ranking third was the American Medical Association, while the Center for Science in the Public Interest and the Humane Society of the US ranked fourth and fifth. Meat industry organizations like NCBA and USMEF were ranked in the middle of the pack, and news outlets like the *New York Times* ranked very low, along with corporate outlets.

Smithsonian Tracking Agriculture

The Smithsonian National Museum of American History is in the process of collecting stories, photos, videos, audio files and other items for an 8,000 square foot exhibition that is scheduled to open in 2015. The Museum intends to weave the items together to show how agriculture has become more efficient and sustainable over time.

A call has been issued for farmers, ranchers and others in agriculture-related industries to contribute to the new hall by submitting items online. The section dedicated for farming and ranching is being designed to be part of a larger American Enterprise exhibition.



Beef Board Gets Good Review

A management review of the Cattlemen's Beef Board (CBB), by the Livestock, Poultry and Seed Program of USDA's Agricultural Marketing Service (AMS) has verified that the Beef Board is operating within the provisions of the Beef Promotion and Research Act.

The AMS review noted in a press release that there were "no reportable findings indicating that CBB adhered to the AMS guidelines for oversight of research, and promotion programs."

Checkoff Support Highest in 21 Years

According to a recent survey, support for the beef checkoff has reached 78%, the highest in more than two decades. The random survey was conducted by the independent firm Aspen Media and Market Research.

The survey found:

- 80% say the checkoff had contributed to a positive trend in demand.
- 79% say the checkoff represents their interests.
- 77% say the checkoff is there for them in a crisis.
- 71 % say the checkoff contributes to profitability.
- 67% believe the checkoff is well-managed.

Cattle Numbers Contract Again

Not unexpectedly, US cattle inventories shrank again in 2013, although heifer numbers tend to suggest a shift toward expansion, according to USDA's January Cattle Report. In that report, all cattle totaled 87.7 million head, down 2% from 2012. That is the lowest inventory of all cattle since 1951.

A total of 38.3 million females calved during 2013, down just 1% from the 38.5 million head a year ago. That is the fewest calving females since 1941. In Kansas, calving beef cow numbers were up 6%, with Arkansas and Missouri increasing by 4%. Idaho calving numbers led the decline, down by 13%.

Cropland Erosion Stablized

Contrary to expected results, a new report from USDA's Natural Resources Conservation Service shows that cropland erosion rates remained stabled between 2007 and 2010, despite a growth in agricultural land use and more extreme weather events.

During that time period, the following land uses changes were recorded.

- Cropland increased by 2 million acres.
- Pastureland increased by 847,000 acres.
- Developed land increased by 2 million acres.

Expiration Dates Confuse Consumers

Researchers from Harvard law School contend that the expiration dates on food labels cause "mass confusion" among consumers and contribute to huge volumes of food that are thrown away each year.

Their report indicates that more than 90% of Americans prematurely toss food away because they misinterpret food labels as indicators of food safety. Phrases like 'sell by', 'use by', and 'best before', are often misinterpreted and leading to a false confidence in food safety.



Increased Highway Loads Considered

Cattle producers would save money and reduce their carbon footprint if a proposal to raise load limits for trucks is approved. The US Department of Transportation is conducting a comprehensive study of truck size and weight limits.

Proponents of increasing load limits point out that there would be fewer shipments, thus saving on fuel costs and other shipping expenses, while reducing use of resources, which impact the environment. Opponents believe that the increased weights would lead to increased road maintenance costs, which would be passed along to taxpayers.

Drone Leads to Arrest and Conviction

A Predator drone, on loan from the Department of Homeland Security's Customs and Border Patrol, was used to locate and arrest a North Dakota homeowner who had refused to return cattle that had wandered on to his property and an armed standoff that followed.

Following an 18-hour standoff, the drone was employed to locate the man and his sons on his property. During his trial, his lawyer argued that use of the drone "was a guerrilla-type police tactic. He was found guilty of terrorizing police, but was acquitted of theft and criminal mischief.

Cheese Keeps Roads Ice-Free

Salty cheese brine was substituted for salt this past winter when Wisconsin municipalities began to run out of salt on their icy roads. The watery solution contains the same Sodium Chloride that gets sold by the ton as a road de-icer.

The brine isn't available in large enough quantities to completely replace road salt, but officials turned to the brine as a way to substantially reduce dependence on traditional salt. Cost of the brine is free, since it must be disposed of once it is used in the manufacturer of cheese.

PETA's Record of Hypocrisy

The People for Ethical Treatment of Animals (PETA) organization is well known for championing rights for animals by generating millions of dollars in donations through vigorous public relations campaigns featuring a host of well-known sympathetic celebrities.

However, a recent report by the Virginia Department of Agriculture reveals that PETA killed 82% of the dogs and cats taken into its Norfolk shelter. Since 1998, 31,190 animals have been euthanized. Despite an annual budget of \$32 million, PETA elects to spend its funds on an all-out propaganda campaign rather than on the animals it claims to protect. ◆



The VetGun is powered by CO2 and is accurate up to a range of 15-20 feet. Animals generally show little reaction and immediately return to feeding.

Real-Time Test for Trich

Life Technologies Corporation has announced the availability of the only USDA-licensed, real-time PCR test to detect Tritrichomonas foetus, a sexually transmitted disease in cattle that leads to early embryonic losses and infertility, causing significant economic impact on the cattle industry.

The VETMAX-Gold Trich Detection Kit provides veterinary diagnostic laboratories with a test that provides highly sensitive and specific results. Accurate testing to identify positive bulls is the only method of preventing spread of Trichomoniasis disease prior to cows being exposed.

Season Long Insect Control

A broad-spectrum premise spray called Annihalator™ Polyzone® has been introduced by Bayer HealthCare, LLC's Animal Health Division. According to the company, the product provides livestock producers with long-term control of crawling, flying and wood-infesting pests.

The technology allows the product to withstand aggressive surfaces, severe weather and wash-off conditions for up to 90 days. The residual enables users to maintain control with fewer applications, thus resulting in reduce labor.

Chipotle Leads Anti-Ag Movement

The Chipotle Mexican Grill Restaurant Chain has launched a new satirical series, which targets farming and ranching. The firm, which advocates 'food with integrity," has released a four-part comedy series, entitled "Farmed and Dangerous," on an on-line streaming service. The advertising effort marks the second such attempt by the company to built its own reputation by denigrating others.

According to a company press release, the series "satirizes the lengths to which corporate agribusiness and its image-makers will go to create a positive image of industrial agriculture." The series also takes jabs at antibiotics and food libel laws.

Animal Health Companies Raise R&D

In 2012, member companies of the Animal Health Institute (AHI) invested \$747 million on Research and Development (R&D) of new medicines for animals and the maintenance of existing products. That figure is 4.6% higher over the previous year.

R&D spending is calculated according to the type of product manufactured by AHI's member firms, including pharmaceuticals, biologics, feed additives, insecticides and diagnostics. The report covers combined sales for ruminants, swine, poultry, small animals and equine products. ◆

INTERNATIONAL

November Strong for Red Meat

US beef meat exports experienced a dramatic increase during November of 2013, establishing a new annual record for value with a month to go in the year, according to a report released by USDA and the US meat Export Federation.

The increase has been driven by sustained export growth to Japan and Hong Kong, and a continued rebound in demand from Mexico. US beef exports surged by 11% in volume and 16% in value when compared to November of 2012. Export value reached \$5.61 billion through November, compared to \$5.51 billion for all of 2012.

Vets Train on **Foreign Diseases**

There are an estimated 1.5 billion cows, 1 billon hogs, 1 billion sheep and 19 billion chickens worldwide. Because the world is growing increasingly interconnected through international travel and trade, USDA is moving pre-emptively against potential disease outbreaks.

USDA's Animal and Plant Health Inspection Service (APHIS) is offering training classes to help familiarize veterinarians with the most serious animal diseases, providing a global network of high-trained individuals who can work collectively, while identifying and containing the damage.

Global Dairy Influenced

A pair of reports from Rabobank's Food and Agribusiness Research Team underscores the influence of the Chinese economy on global dairy trade. China is buying huge quantities of dairy products on the international market and squeezing other buyers in the process. A domestic shortage has kept China on the buying side of the export market.

China is already the world's largest importer of dairy products, and its domestic supplies remain extremely tight. The country's dairy imports rose by 27% in late 2013 when compared to the previous year, while domestic production was declining by another 6% over the same time period.

Canada May Retaliate Against COOL

Canada's agriculture ministry is considering a response to the US Country-of-Origin Labeling (COOL) legislation. The controversial congressional action requires meat labels to state where the animal was born, raised and slaughtered. US processors, worried about extra costs of COOL are choosing to accept only animals born in the US.

Canada claims that the decision is costing the country's beef producers an estimated \$1 million annually, and that country is contemplating action that could range from an all-out trade war, involving severe import tariffs, or referring the dispute back to the World Trade Organization.

Australian Drought Has Global Impacts

Severe and on-going drought in Australia has forced cattleman there, the world's third largest beef exporter, to cull cows, instilling fears of a global beef shortage in coming years. The impact becomes even greater when consideration is given to the fact that the US cow herd it at is lowest number in more than six decades.

The deep culling currently underway could boost the world beef supply in the short term, but would in all likelihood lead to long term shortages due to a lack of breeding stock. •
