#### VIEWPOINT

After my last viewpoint, people only remembered the story I told, so I'd thought I start this viewpoint with a story.

#### Country Perception — A Little Bit Different

A farmer drove to a neighbor's farmhouse and knocked at the door. A boy, about nine, opened the door.

"Is your dad or mom home?" said the farmer. "No, they went to town." "How about your brother, Howard? Is he here?"

"No, he went with mom and dad."

The farmer stood there for a few minutes, shifting from one foot to another, and mumbling to himself.

"I know where all the tools are if you want to borrow one, or I can give dad a message."

"Well," said the farmer uncomfortably, "I really wanted to talk to your dad. It's about your brother Howard getting my daughter Suzy pregnant."

The boy thought for a moment. "You would have to talk to dad about that. I know he charges \$500 for the bull and \$50 for the pig, but I don't know how much he charges for Howard."

Deciding not to run again for the North Central Trustee was a difficult decision made more on a personal choice



for my immediate future. I can say during my three years, I experienced great moments and some lows. Being a Trustee is not an entry level position for the inexperienced and the unknown. Here the road to success is always under construction.

In the years of 2016 and 2017, I'm celebrating a 50-year anniversary since going on my senior trip to Vietnam (actually college trip). Coming home, I look upon it as a gift to experience the things I grew up enjoying most, working with livestock. As Will Rogers said: "If you want to be successful, it's just this simple. Know what you are doing, love what you are doing, and believe in what you are doing."

In 1968, coming back to civilian life the world was changing drastically. It was the decade of change, the 60's. In the livestock world, the continental breeds(exotics) were being introduced to the beef industry. Hereford, Angus and Shorthorn were being challenged for domination of the market place. Little did we know then how much impact these exotic breeds would have.

The race was on to make them purebred, polled and Americanize them for the US breeders. Many dollars changed hands in this process, and when the dust cleared from then till now all have played a part in the role of making beef better. The most gratifying is the Simmental breed; its open herdbook and performance information gathering have had the flexibility to stay competitive as a major breed of choice in the US Beef Industry.

Credit must be given to the ones who took on the challenge and made strong and difficult decisions to set the pathway for this great breed to expand and flourish. We have had many great breeders and great Trustees with the foresight to lead the way. A Trustee's job is not always easy to see through the rhetoric and political correctness to reach the right decision. Life is 10% what happens to us and 90% how we respond.

A new chapter in beef production is starting now in the US and around the world. People ask the question, do we really need a breed association? How will we coexist going forward when new technology is changing the very decisions we make each day. Certainly the bias of the past will change. To stay on the cutting edge will take great leadership from the ground up. One of coach John Wooden's "Woodenisms" "Failure is not fatal, but failure to change might be."

Agriculture, in general, is faced with the challenge to feed a hungry world. Beef will be part of the diet. Let us all come together regardless of geographical location to understand the challenges. We need to market 100% of what we raise as Simmental, Simbrah and Simmental-influenced cattle to keep the breed alive and well for the next 50 years. It's not important who starts the game, but who finishes it.

It has been an honor and a privilege to serve the North Central Region and all Simmental breeders. Old slogans never go away, "Breed 'em all Simmental."

In addition to her responsibilities as Secretary of the New York Simmental Association (NYSA) over that time span, she has edited the NYSA's easy-to-read, high-quality, five-times-a-year newsletter.

She has maintained a semen acquisition program that permits members to save substantially on breeding costs through bulk buying. "By purchasing semen in bulk, we save our members 10% to 30%. Our members place their orders the first week in March and I then deal with ABS, Genex, Accelerated Genetics and Cattle Visions to obtain the best deal possible," she commented. "I order it all at one time and when the semen arrives, we hold a meeting here at my farm and distribute the orders."

In an effort to widen her range of contacts, she's a member of the Pennsylvania

and Southern New England Simmental Associations, and in turn, she's led many breeders from those two organizations to join the 100-member NYSA.

A couple of decades ago, impressed by the competition format of the ASA Junior program, she organized Fall Festival, an all-breeds, state-wide cattle event. "The AJSA program was my pattern. It's a cattle show where the kids have meat identification, judging, a stockman's quiz, team marketing and team fitting besides the cattle show and showmanship," she explained. "Kids can show up without cattle and still participate in the other competitions. Cash prizes totaling \$7,000 to \$8,000 are given to the place-winners in each event. I retired from that event last year — it is a program that is still running strong."

A native of Rhode Island, she left the "Ocean State" as a 19-yearold, landing in Kansas, where she met her husband, Ken. After their marriage, the young couple began a five-year partnership with his father, then branched out on their own.

"We started out raising registered Quarter Horses, but had difficulty getting the prices we thought they were worth. Because Kenny was so frustrated, we decided to switch to cattle even though we really didn't have a clue," she said. "We bought a handful of commercial crossbred females that we bred to Simmental. Ken went to A.I. school, and we bred up artificially from there. In 1972, we joined ASA and were issued member number 8945."



In 1978, the decision was made to relocate to New York, where Ken's father had opened a shop that specialized in rebuilding starters and alternators. When his father offered him a partnership in the shop, Ken bought a 50% interest, precipitating the move.

"By then we were hooked on our cattle, so we brought a dozen cows with us from Kansas, including two three-quarter females and 10 halfbloods. One of the cows, which belonged to our daughter, Michelle, calved after we arrived, giving us our first purebred. We named that calf Miss New Yorker," she reported.

Their first experience with Simmental genetics had involved some of the great sires in the history of the breed, including such familiar names as Lacombe Achilles, Galant and Signal. "At the time, those were moderate bulls, red and white, spotted and horned, of course," she recalled. "We were breeding for steers at that time and our focus was on carcass. As a result, like a lot of other breeders, we let them get too big."

When the beef industry began a long, slow process of bringing down frame size and thus efficiency, it paralleled a move by Simmental breeders to change hide color. "We were good with the frame downsizing, but we were reluctant to switch to blackhided cattle because we thought that the early black bulls were inferior to the red bulls primarily because there were a lot fewer of them," she said.

Then in the year 2000, the Whites got lucky. "We purchased a pregnant, purebred cow that was carrying a bull calf embryo that we weren't the least bit interested in. We bought her just because she was a good cow. We hit the jackpot with that calf. He was homozygous black and homozygous polled, had a frame score of 5.5 and he was awesome!"

Named "Simme Valley Macho As U," he became the centerpiece of their cowherd. "That was the turning point for us switching our herd to black. We used him as a cleanup bull and by A.I. We collected him and still use his semen today. We also advertised Macho widely and sold semen on him," she said.

Tragically, Ken was stricken with lung cancer and passed in 2012 at the age of 65, after a long, courageous battle. He had left the partnership with his father years before, and at the time of his death, was managing a fertilizer plant. He had also served as NYSA president and leader.

Jeanne has kept the farm going with the help of a nephew. "My sister's son, Philip Paradis, had spent summers with us when he was 10, 11 and 12, a highlight of his life," she said. "When Ken passed, he called me and said 'Auntie, would you like me to come and help you?' At first I said 'no' but got to thinking that calving was coming up and I called him to come here in January to help for 60 days. That was in January of 2013 and he's still here. He's my herdsman!"

Their cowherd had reached its peak of 65 head just before Ken became ill, but has since been reduced to a more manageable number. "We're at 40 now, but have 20 replacement heifers ready to come on," she said.

She uses ASA's programs as tools. "My go-to numbers are Calving Ease EPDs and the All-Purpose Index (\$API)," she says. "I think they are fantastic tools and breeders who ignore them are being foolish.

> The \$API blends everything together and projects the bottom line, which is realizing a profit."

Her market for bulls is limited, selling 3-5 bulls annually, despite the fact that herds are small in their area. which is located in the

picturesque Finger Lakes region of upstate New York. She keeps no bulls of breeding age on the farm, preferring to move them at 9-10 months of age.

"My primary objective is to market females, and we're fortunate that commercial and purebred breeders alike seem to be on the lookout for quality replacement heifers. I promote them mostly through showing, that's the best exposure I can get," she said. "I have a good market for heifers as show prospects and I consign cow/calf pairs to the Gettysburg Stars and Stripes Sale in Pennsylvania.'

She is sold on the effectiveness of fence line weaning which permits cows and calves to see, smell and bed down next to each other. She points out that it is a least-stress method and limits bawling.

Jeanne and Ken have one daughter, Michelle Bennett, who lives in Vermont with her husband, Randy. Growing up, Michelle was very involved with Simmental and took her small herd with her when she married Randy, a dairy farmer who also raised Simmental. Michelle's two sons, Cody and Cory, now 27 and 25, respectively, were very active in the AJSA program, attending numerous National Classics until they aged out. "They usually won the award for having traveled the longest distance," she laughed.

"Cory is now running the dairy, while Randy, Michelle and Cody operate a trucking business for a living. They own four tractors and several trailers," Jeanne added.

Now 69, White shows no signs of slowing down. "I'm 69 years young," she emphasized. I love to deer hunt, fish for bass, dance and play pool, and I'm absolutely passionate about raising and showing quality Simmental cattle."




## From The Heart of Huizenga

AJSA President Kaylie Huizenga answers questions posed by the Register's Emme Troendle.

Troendle: Please provide background information on yourself and your family.

I hope to obtain a B.S. and M.S. in Animal Science and continue onto a Doctorates Degree in Ruminant Nutrition. My dream career would be in the area of animal nutrition and working with feedlot producers to create the most efficient feed rations for their cattle.

I plan to continue raising Simmental cattle and promote my own line of Simmental genetics to commercial breeders. In the end, I would like to give back to the organizations that helped shape me into who I am today, such as 4-H and the American Simmental Association.

We use embryo transfer and also focus on raising Simmental bulls with balanced EPDs for commercial breeders. #### Troendle: Share your involvement in AJSA and state junior programs.

Troendle: Are there any especially memorable AJSA events that stand out to you? Explain.

Not only do they provide the merit scholarships that help us continue our education, but they are continuously supportive of our junior program. **Huizenga:** It's important for all breeds to have forward progression in breeding. Throughout the years Simmentals have been the leader in improving the science of genetics. ### Recognized

ASA taps three breeders with long-time affinity for Simmental genetics to receive the prestigious World Simmental-Fleckvieh Federation Golden Book Award.

#### Berry, Drake, Pine Ridge Honored

#### Jim Berry, Scales Mound, Illinois

An advocate for Simmental genetics since 1983, Jim Berry has maintained an on-going emphasis on collection of data in his pursuit of beef cattle performance.

Weights are recorded and reported on all cattle at birth, weaning as yearlings. He also collects weights on his cows each year. In addition, he was among the earliest proponents of ultrasound technology as a tool for making advances in carcass quality. Early on, Berry recognized the significance of the development of composite cattle to improve performance and longevity.

His Wildberry Farms, located in the rocky, hill region of the northwest corner of Illinois, has been a destination for countless international and domestic tour groups. An accomplished speaker, he has willingly extolled the virtues of Simmental cattle to visitors from agriculture, education and curious city dwellers.

Berry was born in northern Illinois where his family started out in the dairy business, later moving to central South Dakota and switching to commercial Angus. As a young man, Berry returned to Illinois when he enrolled at Northwestern University in Evanston. After graduation, he elected to stay in the Chicago area and joined the Chicago Board of Trade in 1966, remaining there until retirement in 1997.

From 1973, when he purchased a small farm, his "day job" required a 110-mile commuter train round trip each day between the farm where the Berry family lived and his work at the Board of Trade. "But, I was very happy with that arrangement," he said.

Deeply involved in agricultural organizations, he served two terms on the Board of the Illinois Beef Association; has been active in several levels of the Farm Bureau; was a member of the Chicago Farmers Club; and was named Breeder-of-the-Year by the Illinois Simmental Association in 2011.

In 2013, out of respect for his good friend, Dr. Bob Walton, former CEO of American Breeders Service, (now simply "ABS") he funded the Walton-Berry Graduate Student Support Grant, which pays tribute to Walton's lifelong efforts in animal breeding and devotion to Simmental cattle. The Walton-Berry grant is earmarked in support of graduate education in research programs to improve applied livestock genetics.

Berry and his wife, Ann, are the parents of three grown children: Robert, Christine and Elizabeth.

#### Dr. Calvin Drake, Manhattan, Kansas

A profound belief in the science of cattle production has marked the long career of Calvin Drake, Ph.D. A native of Kansas, Drake was an early proponent of Simmental genetics, producing his first halfblood calves in the late 1960s. He promptly joined the fledgling American Simmental Association receiving membership 643, and has been an avid promoter and progressive breeder ever since.

Drake's education and broad-based career revolved around his relationship with Kansas State University (KSU). After earning his B.S. degree at KSU and serving a two-year hitch in the US Army, he then enrolled at the University of Arkansas, where he picked up his Master's degree, followed by his Ph.D. from KSU. In 1963, he was hired at Virginia Polytechnic Institute (now Virginia Tech University) where he taught beef science and coached the livestock judging team. Four years later, Drake returned to KSU, where he also taught beef science, coached the judging team and added management of the beef cattle research unit to his job description. His 1967 judging team won the national championship. By 1971, he had departed from KSU to manage three commercial feedlots. After eight years, he returned to KSU as Executive Director of the Livestock and Meat Industry Council. He again coached the judging team, winning a second National Championship before retiring in 1999.

In 2010, Drake was elected to the ASA Board of Trustees, serving two three-year terms. His tenure on the Board was highlighted by three years on the Executive Committee and four years as chairman of the Breed Improvement Committee. During that time, the committee was an essential factor in the formation

of International Genetics Solutions (IGS) and its eventual status as the largest genetic evaluation system in the beef industry. His background as judging team coach, university teacher and researcher, and manager of commercial feedlots brought a unique and varied experience to the Board.

As a Simmental breeder, he frequently consigned bulls to the Kansas Bull Test, and in 2003, was one of six breeders who joined forces to form the Gold Bullion Group, which holds an annual sale. Active in his community, he's been involved in the Methodist Church and as an advisor to FarmHouse Fraternity at KSU which he joined as an undergraduate student. He is widely known and respected within the livestock industry in Kansas and much of the nation.

#### Pine Ridge Ranch, Dallas and Athens, Texas

After a number of years as commercial cattle breeders, Bill and Jane Travis of Pine Ridge Ranch (PRR) sat down one day and outlined a specification for producing the most heat-tolerant, efficient, high-quality carcass and tender beef. Their list contained 35 characteristics identified as "opportunity loss" such as horns.

In 1981, frustrated by their inability to find any animals that met their rigid specifications, they determined to create their own specified cattle and settled on a pathway of crossbreeding registered Brahman and Simmental.

As a result, PRR, located at Athens, Texas, currently maintains a herd of 750 registered Simbrah cattle within its 1,000 acres.

They were first exposed to Simmental genetics when two bulls were purchased from a Kansas breeder in 1977. In 1983 they joined the American Simmental Association and enthusiastically embraced a role as registered, seedstock producers.

Since that time, they have stayed true to their original vision to develop a Simbrah herd for an exceptionally

tender, healthy beef for the consumer. The PRR goal is to produce a 1,350-1,450 pound steer at 14-16 months without use of growth promotants.

Because their cattle tend to marble later, they do not gain excess backfat. The PRR program has proudly, consistently produced tender carcasses grading at 85% Choice with no Yield Grade 4s or 5s.

Strong support of ASA and the beef industry have been hallmarks of the Travis legacy. They have participated in numerous events and have thrown their support behind research and development along with youth programs. Bill has served as ASA's representative to the National Cattlemen's Beef Association, and together, they have been intimately involved in the World Simmental-Fleckvieh Federation and numerous international events.

Jane holds a BA degree from Southern Methodist

University, while Bill obtained a B.S. degree in engineering from the University of Texas, and later an MBA from the Harvard Business School.

Bill and Jane, whose primary residence is in Dallas, roughly 60 miles northwest of the ranch, have been married for 58 years and are the parents of four children: Toby Lynn Travis, Karen Zachary, Diane Jolley, and Bryan Travis.

## Multi-breed Stayability: First EPDs Using BOLT

It's here! The Spring 2017 evaluation includes a multi-breed stayability EPD using the much anticipated new genetic evaluation software, dubbed BOLT. The stayability EPD uses a random regression approach to predict stayability developed by Dr. Janusz Jamrozik and colleagues from the University of Guelph and the Canadian Simmental Association. Dr. Scott Speidel at Colorado State University, Dr. Bruce Golden (Theta Solutions), and the genetics team at International Genetic Solutions (IGS) (Lauren Hyde, Wade Shafer, Mahdi Saatchi, and Steve McGuire) worked together to incorporate the new methodology into the IGS evaluation. The new stayability evaluation includes data on animals of varying breed composition, directly incorporates genomic data, produces true accuracy values and provides stayability EPDs to all IGS partners on a common base.

The new stayability EPD is calculated for all cattle in the database.

#### Features of the Multi-breed stayability with BOLT:

1) Multi-breed stayability. As mentioned, the new stayability EPD is calculated for all cattle in the database (not just for purebred and fullblood Simmental). As stayability is a very important economically relevant trait for female production, the ability to have stayability calculations on all cattle will improve the prediction of the All Purpose Index in hybrid cattle and cattle of other breeds.

- 2) Direct incorporation of genomic data. Because BOLT was used to calculate the Stayability EPD, the evaluation used the DNA markers, pedigree information, and phenotypic data simultaneously in the prediction of the stayability EPD. Previously molecular breeding values (MBVs) were calculated from the genomic information and those MBVs were blended separately into the EPD prediction. The new direct method of including DNA markers not only improves the genomically enhanced EPD for the genotyped animal but also uses this information in the EPD calculations of relatives.
- 3) Better prediction of accuracy. The BOLT software calculates a true accuracy of the EPD rather than an approximation of accuracy. With the limitations of the old software and computer memory, calculating true accuracy was not an option as the system of equations was too large and cumbersome to manipulate. In addition, the method of approximation tended to inflate accuracy values. What does this mean to breeders? In most cases, animals will have a decrease in reported accuracy for stayability but this reported accuracy will be the true accuracy for the EPD. True accuracy values help producers better manage risk associated with bull selection.
- 4) Change in base: With all the changes made to the stayability evaluation, the base for stayability has changed for purebred and fullblood Simmental. All cattle in the IGS collective will be on the same base and comparable directly with each other. Breeders will see movement in stayability EPD from previous evaluations, not only because of changes to methodology but also because of a base change. However, changing the base does not affect the ranking of cattle; it simply shifts all EPDs up or down by the same increment.

## MARC Hosts DNA Technology Conference

I represented ASA at the "DNA Technology in Beef Cattle" conference at the US Meat Animal Research Center (MARC) October 17 and 18. There were 69 seedstock and commercial producers and scientists from MARC and several other universities in attendance.

John Pollak, Director of MARC, gave an introduction in which he described MARC as a "living lab" where various kinds of projects were being conducted, in addition to research on meat animals. He described the USMARC/University of Nebraska-Lincoln research initiative; the NCBA Sustainability Project; an anti-microbial resistance project; a fly resistance project; and water containment facilities to determine the presence and persistence of AMR bacteria and genes.

Darrh Bullock, University of Kentucky, discussed Genetic Tools to Meet Breeder's Objectives. With use of audience 'clickers' rankings of eight important traits for the ideal cow on a scale of one to 10, the eight traits ranked from about 4.5 to 5.5, illustrating that all eight traits were of similar importance among the audience mix of seedstock and commercial producers and researchers.


Matt Spangler, University of Nebraska, did his usual excellent job of discussing "Current Status of Genomic Selection". He stated that the ASA has the second largest number of animals with genomic information (genotyped animals). He emphasized that proper blending of Molecular Breeding Values (MBV) and Estimated Breeding Values is important. For high-accuracy animals, MBV contributes very little to the accuracy of the animal's EPD. The largest benefit is for non-parent animals. BOLT technology represents the largest change in commercially available software for genetic evaluation in the beef industry in a long time, and will be launched very soon. However, it does not

overcome all of the challenges facing National Cattle Evaluation. It will be up to breeders to generate the necessary phenotypes to enable NCE. It will allow dramatically faster genetic evaluation.

Allison Van Enennaam, University of California-Davis, discussed her research on Bovine Respiratory Disease (BRD) as part of a large collaborative USDA integrated grant. Most of her work has been with an extremely large dairy ranch (70,000 head), and a modest sized feedlot (1,000 head). Heritability estimates ranged from 0.17 to 0.29, depending on the definition of BRD. Decreased susceptibility to BRD is a very valuable trait. New guidelines are being developed to standardize selection for BRD phenotypes. www.brdcomplex.org

Bob Weaber, Kansas State University, discussed the large Feed Efficiency project involving several universities and MARC. The goals are to develop initial genomic predictors for multiple beef breeds for the purposes of National Cattle Evaluation. Initial Genome-Wide Association Studies focused on Angus, Simmental, Hereford and animals from the Germplasm Evaluation project at USMARC, although the feed intake phenotypic and genomic resources for other breeds are continually increasing. He discussed some of the results from nutritional studies as part of the project as well. For the ASA, Dry Matter Intake (DMI) is included in the \$API and \$TI. The phenotypic correlation between Grow phase Residual Feed Intake (RFI) and Finish phase RFI is 0.63. However, the phenotypic correlation between Grow phase Average Daily Gain ADG and Finish phase ADG is only 0.11. This illustrates the robustness of feed intake measurements over different periods but the sensitivity of gain measurements. Both a

forage and high grain diet are being evaluated in the project. Forage RFI and Grain RFI are modestly correlated. Relationships of RFI and traits like marbling are being investigated. www.feedefficiency.org

Megan Rolf, Kansas State University, talked about another funded USDA grant centered on female fertility and includes the investigation of recessive genetic defects that might be responsible for decreases in fertility (early embryonic mortality). Animals can be carriers and produce progeny that are carriers, but only when there are homozygous alleles is there a deleterious effect. A unique component of this project is the development of software to enable seedstock producers to determine matings that optimize the breeding goals and inbreeding.

Larry Kuehn, US MARC, gave an excellent presentation on getting the most out of genomic selection. Genotyping is the ultimate 'indicator trait'. He emphasized the need for more data on "novel traits" such as resistance to BRD, tenderness, lung lesions, etc. It would be beneficial to obtain data from commercial producers, such as feedlot and beef processor data. Data from 2% of producers or processors would exceed data from seedstock herds now being collected. He discussed the technique of 'DNA pooling' to estimate gene frequencies. This technique can reduce genotyping costs dramatically. There is also the need for breed associations to do 'structured sire evaluations' to enable the collection of sparsely recorded traits including carcass traits and fertility.

Spangler also discussed "phenotypes needed for training" and discussed EPDs versus "degressed" EPDs, a technique in which high and low accuracy animals can be included in the same analysis. This technique allows EPDs to be used as 'phenotypes' in genomic analysis that estimates the effects of SNPs. He stated that the difference in the average genetic correlation for the 50K and

80K panels is negligible and that simply adding more SNPs does not help prediction of overall genetic merit.

Gary Bennet, US MARC, discussed new techniques for genomic evaluation with a focus on the loss of functional alleles. Many bulls have more than a few genes that do not function. This results in some loss in performance. He is looking at potential selection using an "index of loss of functional alleles" to determine the impact on female fertility.

Steve Kachman, University of Nebraska, presented results on the performance of the new GGPF250 panel. Initial results suggest that this panel, partly comprised of variants from sequence data, would not help within breed predictions. The next step in his research is to determine if this new panel will aid in the portability (ease or transfer of predictions) of genomic information across breeds.

Pollak discussed the importance of "novel traits" such as tenderness, BRD resistance, etc. Not enough phenotype data can be generated for all novel traits. The transfer of genomic predictions to more distantly related populations has not worked well and simply using more SNP (e.g. 770K) has not alleviated the problem. Consequently, the use of selected variants from sequence data and advanced statistical methodology are current research thrusts.

On another topic, Pollak stated that MARC does not have an extension program to extend information to the industry. The National Beef Cattle Evaluation Consortium (NBCEC) was formed to do that. Therefore, a partnership between MARC and NBCEC is designed to extend information to the industry. The ARS has submitted a request for funding to be included in the 2018 President's budget.

Overall, the conference was very educational, stimulating, and encouraging. Definite progress is being made in genomic selection.

## What's New in DNA?

#### Big changes in DNA testing now available through the ASA.

the accuracy of predicting an animal's genetic potential. GeneSeek launched a new genomic panel called the **GeneSeek Genomic Profiler uLD or GGP-uLD**. The **GGP-uLD** has about 7,000 DNA markers and offers a more affordable genomic test. ASA recommends GGP-uLD testing for herd sires and replacement heifers when no other DNA tests are of interest. If additional trait testing is needed on the animal, then the GGP-uLD or GGP-LD are better options. The GGP-uLD test does include parent verification (if the parent animals have DNA on file for comparison).

The results of GGP-HD, GGP-LD and GGP-uLD testing are incorporated into an animal's EPDs, thus increasing the accuracy and resulting in the equivalent of 5-10 progeny records for that animal. As you can imagine, genomic testing can have a large impact predicting your herd's genetic potential, especially with regards to replacement heifers since most females would not achieve that level of accuracy until they are 8-10 years of age.

Genomic tests **DO NOT** automatically include trait testing such as horned/polled or coat color results. If additional trait testing is desired, it must be requested when you order the kit.

#### New pricing schedule:

The new pricing structure has "add-on" pricing for traits and conditions generated from the genomic panels. The add-on tests are less expensive than testing these traits independently (stand-alone). Add-on tests are available from the GGP-HD and GGP-LD panels, but are not available with the new GGP-uLD option.

The parental validation fee is reduced in the new fee structure. The previous price was higher in part to compensate for staff time spent on exclusion cases or large multi-sire groups. In the case of an exclusion, the new price will include comparing two additional possible parents. However, if more time is needed beyond these two additional parents, there will be a DNA research fee charged to compensate for additional staff time. The DNA research fee is \$60/hour and will be billed in one dollar increments. For instance, if it takes an additional 15 minutes of staff time to resolve parentage, then the account will be billed an additional \$15.

Previously, members were not charged for samples that failed DNA testing (no results) — the ASA paid for this testing at no expense to the member. Again, covering this testing was built into the higher fees. With the new reduced prices, the ASA will charge members for samples that fail testing.

The ASA will charge a \$5.00 export fee (our cost) for exporting parental markers (SNPs) in the AB format (currently only applies to the American Angus Association).

#### New DNA Sampling Option:

Allflex® has developed a new method of collecting DNA using earnotch tissue samples. This method is easy, has lower sample fail rates, and facilitates faster processing through sample reception with GeneSeek. The new method entails collecting an ear punch into a tube called the Allflex Tissue Sampling Unit or TSU. The TSU contains a barcode and simple number ID. Caution: when using this method, it is imperative to clearly communicate the ID of the animal corresponding to the TSU. The TSU cost \$2.00 per unit and must be ordered in increments of ten. The TSU can be combined with custom ID orders with Allflex tags to connect the barcoded information with ranch tag ID and/or electronic ID tags. The units can be ordered from the ASA or GeneSeek. Please note, large orders may require additional time to order the TSUs from Allflex. Contact the ASA for details on proper handling and protocol with TSU samples.



## **Breed Synergy Generates Profit Advantage for Cattle Raisers**

In a unique beef industry event, three major beef breed associations joined forces to host "Mapping The Maze," a seminar focused on guiding commercial cattlemen through the tangle of genetic, feeding and marketing options.

On October 28, state and national leaders from the Gelbvieh, Simmental and Red Angus breeds invited cattle producers and industry personnel to Mandan, North Dakota, to share insight from their partnership with International Genetic Solutions (IGS). This partnership is an innovative and unprecedented collaboration between progressive breed associations focused on enhancing beef industry profitability." The breed experts also showcased value-added marketing programs geared at putting more dollars in commercial producers' pockets.

By design, breed associations carry an obligation to assist members and their bull-buying customers. American Gelbvieh Association Executive Director Myron Edelman laid the foundation for the seminar by outlining those responsibilities and their alignment to the growing global population and beef consumption.

"Each association's primary duty is to maintain the registry for that breed," Edelman explained. "But, beyond that obvious function is a commitment to provide accurate data and leading-edge technology through research and marketing. Essentially, we provide information to our seed-stock and commercial producers that helps them make educated decisions in order to avoid critical errors in the production performance of their cowherds."

Ranchers and feeders are continually charged with the task of optimizing beef production. In order to feed the world, they must produce more beef in less time with fewer resources — all at a lower cost.

Experts predict the world population will hit 8.5 billion by the year 2030 — an increase of nearly two billion people. That population growth will bring a consumption need for over 28 billion pounds of beef a year — three billion more pounds than produced today. (Source: USDA FAS)

To prepare for the future, breed associations are working diligently to equip producers with tools, like EPDs, to identify which animals possess the most productive genetic traits. "Today's cattle are trending higher weaning and yearling weights which is one step in producing beef faster and more efficiently," Edelman said. He also identified heavier carcass weights and better quality meat with more cattle grading Choice.

"We have a lot of work ahead of us to feed the world's growing population and meet beef consumption needs. Breed associations are the leaders in assisting producers to meet global beef demands with an economic protein source."



#### **SunBelt Expo Draws Crowds**

It was a humid 91 degrees at the 39th Annual Sunbelt Ag Expo in Moultrie, Georgia. A crew of Simmental breeders from Georgia and surrounding states manned a Simmental booth at the event, held October 18-20. 





#### Screwworm Discovered in Florida

USDA's Animal and Plant Health Inspection Service (APHIS) has confirmed the presence of New World screwworm in Key deer from the National Key Deer Refuge in Florida. This is the first infestation in the US in more than 30 years.

In response, the Florida Commissioner of Agriculture declared an agriculture state of emergency in Monroe County. New World screwworms are fly larvae that can infest livestock and other warm-blooded animals, including people. There have been no livestock or human infestation cases so far.

#### TB Traced to Indiana Farm

Indiana officials are investigating a case of Bovine Tuberculosis (TB) in a beef cattle herd in Southeastern Indiana. The TB-positive cattle were identified through routine inspections at a meat processing facility in Pennsylvania.

Veterinarians are in the process of conducting a thorough investigation of the Indiana herd where the animals originated. In a follow-up to the initial report, the infected herd will be depopulated. Six beef steers were condemned at slaughter after exhibiting signs of TB. Indiana had held a bovine TB-free status since 1984 under USDA's official guidelines.

#### Missouri Man Sentenced for Cattle Fraud

A Braymer, Missouri, man was sentenced for a cattle fraud scheme that resulted in losses of more than \$262,000. The accused man admitted that he engaged in a scheme to sell at least 114 mortgaged cattle without paying the loans and instead keeping the funds for his own use.

Additionally, he removed identification tags from 646 head of cattle belonging to others, and mixed these cattle in with his neighbor's, his landlord's, and his own cattle in order to sell the livestock undetected.

#### **Hoagland Completes Dublin Marathon**

Mary Hoagland, a member of the American Simmental Association's information technology (computer programming) staff, completed the world famous Dublin Marathon on October 30. It was her first full marathon, although she has competed in a number of 5K, 10K and half-marathons.

She won the trip through a drawing for participants in the 2016 "Run to the Pub" event held in Bozeman last March and has been training ever since. She completed the course in six hours and 30 minutes against an international field of 19,500 competitors including 6,500 females. More than 55 countries were represented. #### **BEEF BUSINESS**

### Industry Input on Dietary Guidelines Dismissed

A federal court has dismissed a lawsuit filed by a non-profit animal activist group that alleged too much food industry influence on the Dietary Guidelines Advisory Committee (DGAC). In a complaint, the Physicians Committee for Responsible Medicine claimed that USDA and Department of Health allowed the food industry to dictate the DGAC recommendations on cholesterol.

The court ruled that there were no guidelines for determining how much industry influence is too much. As a result, the complaint was deemed "nonjusticiable" and dismissed.

#### Meat Supplies Hit Record High

Total red meat supplies have hit a record-high since the data was first recorded in 1946. According to USDA, total beef, pork, and poultry supplies in refrigerated warehouses are 1.6% higher than earlier this year, and 11% higher than the five-year average.

Total pounds of beef in freezers were at a record-high since the data was first recorded in 1932. Inventories are up 9% from earlier this year, and up 4% from last year.

#### Restaurant, Grocery Price Gap Grows

The gap between the cost of buying groceries and going out to eat has continued to widen, according to USDA's Food Price Index. Leading the decline in prices are cheaper beef, pork, poultry and eggs.

The Consumer Price Index (CPI) for all foods rose 0.1%, and food prices were 0.3% lower compared to last year. The food-away-from-home purchases CPI was up 0.2% and was 2.4% higher than last year, while food-at-home (grocery store or supermarket food items) CPI was 2.2% lower than last year.

#### "Honor System" Grocery Store

A small Iowa grocery store reportedly has used the honor system for the payment of goods since the store opened in 2007. The shed-like store sells products made and raised by the owner's familyrun farm. A money slot, a video surveillance system, and trust are used to monitor transactions.

The family-operation has only experienced two thefts over the years. In one instance, the thief made the motions of paying but didn't drop any cash in the slot, and in the other incident, the person only put \$1 in the slot for \$30 of goods. Both customers later paid the store back.

#### **Growing Interest In Restaurant Delivery**

Research from Mintel, a consumer market research company, has revealed that third-party food delivery services are catching on. The report stated 87% of Americans who use the services say that it makes their lives easier, and of that 87%, 31% use these services at least twice a week.

In total, only 12% of Americans have used a third-party delivery service in the past three months. Among those who do not use these services: 30% would rather order delivery directly from the restaurant, 27% believe that delivery fees are too high, 23% live in an area outside of where companies operate, and 28% say they would rather eat in a restaurant.

#### FSIS Holds Livestock Haulers Accountable

USDA's Food Safety and Inspection Services (FSIS) has announced that the agency intends to hold livestock handlers accountable for humane handling of the animals prior to slaughter when on the premises of an official plant.

Civil or criminal action may be placed against people not employed by an official establishment if they handle livestock inhumanly in connection with slaughter while on-site. Previously, the slaughterhouse was held accountable for handling of animals while on the premises.



#### **Farms Turn to Precision Ag**

Precision Agriculture requires a significant investment of capital and time but may offer cost savings and higher yields through more precise management of inputs. According to an economic research report, yield mapping is used on about 40% of US corn and soybean acres, GPS soil mapping on about 30%, guidance systems on more than 50%, and variable-rate technology (VRT) on 28-34% of acres.

Yield mapping grew faster for corn and soybeans than for other crops, while adoption of soil mapping varied substantially across crops. Tractor guidance systems have grown faster than VRT input applications for all major field crops over the last 10 years.

#### **Battery Kills 86** Head of Cattle

Eighty-six head of cattle have died on a farm in Iowa after eating from a feed wagon that contained a ground-up battery. The owner was out of town, and a neighbor was feeding when the poisoning occurred. Only 16 cattle have survived the incident: 10 steers — three are blind, two cows, and four calves.

Blood and tissue samples were sent to Iowa State University (ISU), and the toxicology report showed extremely high levels of lead poisoning. Officials have indicated that only one farm has been affected by the incident, and how the battery was ground up and entered the cattle feed has yet to be determined.

#### ND Livestock Missing, Injured, Killed

In four separate incidences, livestock were reported missing, killed, or butchered in Sioux County, ND. The first incident included one dead horse, four dead cows, and 30 head of cows missing. Later the same day, three bison were found dead and butchered in the same area.

Three days later, the owner of the dead horse and cows reported two cows had been shot: one with with a small-caliber firearm, and the other was shot with multiple arrows. Both have been treated by a veterinarian and may survive. The next day, the same individual who reported the first incident reported another dead horse.

#### **Hurricane Damages Carolina Ag**

Reports show that North Carolina's agriculture industry took significant damage from Hurricane Matthew. State agriculture officials do not have damage estimates, but the 48 counties affected by the storm are North Carolina's largest agricultural counties, accounting for more than \$9.6 billion of the \$13.5 billion in farm cash receipts in 2014.

According to the state's agriculture commissioner, the eastern counties represent 71 % of the state's total farm receipts. "While many crops were harvested before the storm, many crops such as soybeans, sweet potatoes, peanuts and cotton, were in the early stages of harvest." Additionally, the extensive flooding from the hurricane has reportedly killed five million chickens.



#### Vaccine Reduces Antibiotic Use

Kansas State University (KSU) researchers have patented a vaccine that provides an antibiotic-free prevention and treatment of Fusobacterium necrophorum infection. The bacterium causes liver abscesses, calf diphtheria, foot rot or abscesses in sheep and cattle.

The vaccine is designed as an alternative to antibiotics currently used to control the infection. It works by immunizing the animal against leukotoxins, and by preventing the bacterium from attaching to organs. The vaccine is currently in testing for cattle, and may eventually be available for sheep and people.



#### Immune Restorative Decreases Food Waste

Elanco Animal Health has developed Imrestor, an immune restorative, to reduce the chance of mastitis in cattle. Imrestor is not an antibiotic, vaccine, or hormone but, is similar to a cow's immune system so the cow may function normally. Clinical tests of the immune restorative have shown a reduced incidence of mastitis in calving cows by 28% in the US in the 30 days post-calving.

Health regulations prohibit the sale of milk with antibiotic residue, so 1.2 billion servings of milk are lost each year from the dairy chain. The new development decreases the need for antibiotics and other treatments, along with reducing the amount of milk discarded during the treatment cycle.

## **Drought Resistant Crops Developed**

Research led by the Australian National University (ANU) has helped develop food crops with higher yields and a greater ability to cope with drought conditions when compared with today's plants.

The researchers explained that by studying the role of a key enzyme in crops such as sorghum and millet, they were able to determine that these crops have a much greater yield and are better at resisting drought and other extreme conditions when compared to crops like wheat and rice.

#### Labeling Unlikely to Encourage Healthy Eating

Researchers from New York University (NYU) have shown fast-food calorie counts don't help consumers make healthy choices. Researchers found that only 8% of fast food eaters are likely to make healthy choices as a result of calorie labeling nationwide.

In the beginning of 2017, the Food and Drug Administration (FDA) will require all chain restaurants, with at least 20 outlets, to post calorie information. Despite the rapid and widespread adoption of policies to require calorie counts at restaurants, most studies have little evidence that fast-food consumers are changing their behaviors in response to the labels.







#### First Brazilian Beef Shipment Arrives

After 17 years of negotiations between the US and Brazil, Sao Paulo-based JBS SA shipped the first fresh beef from Brazil to the US in nearly two decades, arriving in the Port of Philadelphia. JBS's shipment is the first of a handful of Brazilian processors that the USDA has listed as eligible to export to the US. Other companies exporting to the US are Marfrig and Minerva.

According to the Philadelphia Regional Port Authorities, the agreement says that 3,000 pounds of Brazilian beef will be shipped monthly from the Port of Itapoa to the US.

#### **Meat Industry Pushing for TPP**

The meat industry has been championing the Trans-Pacific Partnership (TPP) since negotiations began eight years ago. According to industry association calculations, with the US population growing at less than 1% a year, animal protein industry growth depends largely on more meat and poultry boarding boats to foreign consumers in faster growing markets.

In the first quarter of 2016, the US exported 25% of pork produced, 16% of chicken, and 13% of beef. Without the trade barrier concessions built into the TPP, both beef and pork could lose out to competing exporters in hay markets like Japan, while poultry exporters were looking for Canadian concessions built into the pact.

#### **Global Food Prices Surge**

World food prices rose 2.9%, the highest since March 2015, led mainly by increased sugar and dairy costs. Food and Agriculture Organization's (FAO) food price index has been increasing steadily since the beginning of the year, supported by a spike in sugar and moderate increases in dairy, meat, and oil products.

The meat price index has increased 12.6% since hitting a five-year low earlier in 2016. The largest increase in meat processing for the year was recorded for pork, sheep, and poultry. Price increases for beef have been limited due to a recovery in US production, reducing the need for imports.

#### **Cattle Rustling in India**

Two cattle rustlers in Mahemdavad, India, were caught on camera stuffing a cow into the back seat of a white hatchback car, making a quick getaway. The video was circulated to a local vigilante group who alerted the police. Authorities found the car and arrested one man, but the cow wasn't recovered.

According to Indian news reports, cattle rustling has become a growing phenomenon. Affluent Indians have developed a fondness for beef despite the fact that cows are considered sacred in Hinduism. ◆

## Tyson Invests in Meat Alternative

Tyson Foods, America's largest meat processor, has purchased a 5% stake in Beyond Meat, a California-based company that makes plant-based protein from sources such as soy and peas.

A press release stated that the investment will provide additional capital to help the company expand its product portfolio and distribution. The meatalternative company has received other high-profile investors: The Humane Society of the United States, Bill Gates, and the venture-capital arm of General Mills.

## Cargill Moves to 100% Traceable Beef

Cargill Meat Solutions has announced the launch of its Pasture Crafted Beef program that claims 100% traceable beef. The company stated that the grass fed, grain-finished product, will be traceable from birth to slaughter on sustainably operated ranches.

The Pasture Crafted brand fills a niche market for beef that falls between organically and conventionally raised. The company harvests more than eight million cattle and produces nearly eight billion pounds of boxed beef and byproducts each year, and the traceability of this new system at scale is "unlike anything else in the industry" says Cargill.

#### Amazon to Open Grocery Stores

Amazon.com Inc. has made plans to build small brick-and-mortar grocery stores, some with curbside pick-up, selling perishable items. The stores would stock only fresh foods such as produce, milk, and meat. Items with longer shelf lives can be ordered for same-day delivery.

The perishables-only stores are intended for customers of the company's Fresh subscription service, which sells food for same-day delivery. The service carries a \$15 monthly fee and is availed for subscribers to Amazon's \$99-a-year Prime delivery service.

#### Premium Brands Acquires Belmont Meats

Specialty foods distributor Premium Brands Holding Corporation has acquired 100% of the shares for Canada-based, Belmont Meats Products Limited for \$50 million. The move includes \$49.2 million in cash and \$0.8 million in common shares of Premium Brands.

Belmont Meats is a \$120 million burger patty maker for retailers and foodservice operators in Canada. The buyout comes as Belmont Meats has started to introduce products to the US retail market.

## Wal-Mart Bets on Pickup Service

Wal-Mart has announced the expansion of its pickup service to compete with retailers that offer doorstop delivery; betting customers would rather swing into a parking lot for a few minutes than wait around at home for their food.

The grocery chain has expanded the program, which is free to customers, from five to 80 markets in the past year in efforts to compete with services such as AmazonFresh and Google Express that charge a membership pre-delivery fee. Wal-Mart executives say the service is attracting new customers as well as more affluent shoppers.

#### New Jack Link's Products Unveiled

Jack Link's has unveiled two new breakfast jerky products that are scheduled for release in early 2017. The new products include Applewood bacon jerky, maple bacon jerky, original breakfast sausage and hot-and-spicy breakfast sausage.

The addition represents the first expansion of company's jerky snacks into the breakfast snack arena to provide high-protein snack options for consumers. ◆

- 1 pound ground beef
- 10-ounce package frozen chopped broccoli
- 2 Tbs flour
- 11/4 cups milk
- ½ tsp minced onion
- 3/4 tsp salt
- ½ tsp garlic salt
- 1 egg
- 3-ounce package cream cheese Slices of cheese — Monterey Jack or cheddar cheese
- 1 package crescent rolls

#### Directions

- 1. Brown beef.
- 2. Cook broccoli; drain. Mix flour, milk, onion, salts, egg and cheese in blender until smooth.
- 3. Combine beef, broccoli, and cheese sauce.
- 4. Spread in a greased 9-inch baking dish.
- 5. Cover mixture with slices of cheese.
- Use Italian crescent rolls or plain. Unroll dough and cover cheese to form crush.
- 7. Bake at 350° for 40 minutes. Let stand 10 minutes before serving. Double for a 9 x 13 inch pan.

Opportunities Expand for Youth of Beef Industry

There's a difference between feeding a steer and being a cattle feeder. Sometimes there is even a difference between raising cows and being in the profit-focused beef business. And in a young persons life, there comes a point when the animals they cared so much about start becoming a part of their future and their family's livelihood. Beef breed associations too often assume that their junior members


want the easy way. That they don't want to be pushed. The American Simmental Association (ASA) makes no such assumptions. Through a thorough strategic review of ASA junior programs it was clear that youth members wanted something more — the ability to learn more about the industry and meaningful ways to participate in that industry.

While calves were being born back in the spring, the ASA and American Junior Simmental Association (AJSA) were bringing to life the Steer Profitability Competition (SPC). The SPC is a fed steer contest held at Chappell Feedlot in western Nebraska. AJSA members can enter steers of any breed composition into the contest to view the overall profitability of their calves all the way through harvest at Cargill Meat Solutions in Fort Morgan, CO.

Any breed composition? Why would a breed association take this position? Simple. ASA members and their customers have to compete in the market place with any and all breed types. They recognize and embrace the chance to compare cattle across breeds based on their profit potential for the commercial beef producer. AJSA members are no different. They already embrace the scientific realities of heterosis and crossbreeding. They know to get better you have to put yourself on the line. If you are successful, great! However, if you fall short then you know it's time to get back to work and get better.

Another reason for the open armed approach — young producers who haven't found the right junior program can simply join the AJSA and then enter their calves into the SPC. It's pretty simple — a straight forward program geared to helping young beef producers learn more about the feedyard potential, carcass merit, and overall profitability of the calves they raise or purchase.

A unique component of the SPC is the mandatory monthly online meeting. Once a month, the participants join a nationally recognized expert online to discuss important topics facing our industry. Antibiotic usage, VFD, feedlot nutrition, carcass parameters, shipping slides, DNA and genomics are just some of the topics that will be covered.



Currently, the inaugural SPC class represents over 30 AJSA members, nearly 70 steers, and states from Colorado to Kentucky and from North Dakota to Texas. The steers have been on feed since early November and will be harvested early in the summer of 2017. The winners will be recognized at the AJSA's 2017 National Classic in Hattiesburg, MS.

Ethan Miller of Olean, MO, says that the SPC lets him see "how our cattle compete against others from across the country". He is also very excited to follow the dollars through the process. His sister, Abby, notes that "it gives me a way to showcase my animals outside of the show ring."

A long list of sponsors stepped up to help these young agriculturists through this process. Allflex<sup>®</sup>, Chappell Feedlot, GeneSeek<sup>®</sup>, Zoetis, and insurers Ideal A&M, Lloyds, and Wichert are just some of the groups who have put their support behind the youth of the beef industry.


