A profit and performance oriented family ranch thrives in the rugged mountains of southeastern Idaho.

"I bought my first Simmental heifer from Arbon Valley Simmental. Sitting in that sale, I knew that was where my love was — I was drawn to Simmental," says Dirk Johnson, Bancroft, Idaho, as he recalls attending his first Simmental production sale at the age of 13. He knew that he wanted to be in the cattle industry.

Today, he and his wife, Marnie, are owners and managers of Vertical Edge Genetics, a growing 200-head Simmental, SimAngus™, and Angus enterprise. Dirk explains, "I had been a herdsman and a herd manager, but our hope was to do it for ourselves. In 2010, we struck out on our own. We were pretty tight on numbers for our first production sale in 2011, but we made it work and have never looked back."

The Johnsons' 2,800-acre ranch butts up against Caribou National Forest. The valley is characterized by summer highs over 90 degrees, and winter lows in the -20s, with low rainfall. "It's pretty rugged country here — lots of cedar trees and lava rocks. It's a really good test for our cattle to see how they thrive in this environment," Marni shares, "You definitely see a difference in Angus and Simmental influenced. We see at least 100 pounds in weaning, more muscle, and better fertility."

As a family oriented enterprise, Dirk and Marnie track herd data and implement an exclusive breeding system to make their operation profitable for the next generation.




Performance Driven

To meet the needs of their customers, the Johnsons focus on economically important traits that will have the most impact on profitability. Dirk explains that it all starts with their cow herd, "Our customers are performance oriented, and so are we. I want unassisted births, and trouble-free cows that can make it on their own. I don't make excuses for our cattle, if they fall outside our calving window or have disposition issues, we cull them. We watch feet and legs as well as udder quality too."

Vertical Edge Genetics, as a part of ASA's Total Herd Enrollment program, collects whole herd data on their calves and annual maternal and structure data on cows. "We collect as much data as we can to use in our program, especially on our cows. We strive to design cattle that thrive in our environment, and the data helps us with that," Dirk summarizes the balance of cattle utilizing their environment, "We don't live and die by the scale. There is a huge difference between cattle utilizing grass and cattle utilizing supplements. We provide salt and mineral but do not use supplements."

The cattle forage on non-irrigated, native grass pasture. Marnie states, "It's hard grass, we run our seedstock in a very commercialtype environment. We develop our cattle at a slower rate, but one of the biggest compliments we get from our customers is how good the feet are, and how well they hold up after the first year of breeding." For the rough terrain and forage ground, moderate sized cows are necessary to meet the demands of Vertical Edge Genetics. "Our cows need to be low-maintenance, highproducing, and easy-fleshing to stay in the herd," Dirk explains of their goal to maintain four or 4.5 frame score. "Simmental and Angus have true breed complementarity. People come out thinking that they are going to see a huge SimAngus cow, and they are impressed at the four frame score cows. The cross creates easier fleshing cattle."



Calving starts the first of March, and wraps up after their annual production sale, the last Friday of the month. They sell approximately 50 bulls and 75 females annually to national and regional commercial clients. As a service to their bull buyers, Vertical Edge Genetics encourages a few of their customer's commercial yearling females to be consigned to their sale.

After branding at the end of April, the cow herd is moved to the mountain a few weeks prior to breeding. Cows and replacement heifers are then AI bred for one heat cycle, and later split into individual bull groups. Dirk says, "We only AI once, and we have strong enough herd bulls that we can rely on them as well. We do have a small nucleus herd of Fullblood Fleckvieh cows, 40 head of registered Angus cattle, and the rest are SimAngus. All three breeds are offered at our sale. We have found the Fleckvieh based SimAngus to be our favorite for all around performance."

Selection criteria for breeding is completed using a trademarked analysis system called Beef Cattle Type Analysis™. This system, designed by the Johnsons, emphasizes similar ideology that the seedstock dairy industry uses to identify different types in cattle, and how to mate them to create the most balanced and profitable cow.

Vertical Edge uses this system to discover the areas their cow herd needs greatest improvement, and sires are analyzed to find their greatest strengths in order to pair against cow qualities. Dirk clarifies, "The application of our system is very simple. It's matching needs with strengths. We patented it and use it as our number one mating guide. It's unique to the beef industry." They additionally use line breeding as a tool to develop strong maternal lines.

The cattle graze during the summer at an elevation around 7,000 feet, and in the fall, they are brought back down to the ranch to about 5,800 feet. With the high altitude comes the risk of High Mountain Disease (HMD). It is the result of elevated pulmonary arterial pressure caused from a lack of oxygen and generally affects cattle raised at 5,000 feet or higher. HMD is not limited to one sex or breed of cattle, but can be tested through a pulmonary arterial pressures (PAP) score.

"The Simmental cattle are superior PAP testers," Dirk explains, "We tend to see more problems with the straight Angus, and we haven't heard of any any problems from our customers that have purchased PAP tested SimAngus bulls. Fleckvieh test even lower on average than SimAngus, so they both work very well at high elevation."

Working on the Dream

Dirk's introduction to the Simmental industry was fostered through managing his grandfather's herd of Hereford cows in high school, where he started developing Simmental Hereford cross and SimAngus calves. Throughout school, he also exhibited heifers and steers as a part of the American Junior Simmental Association.

Marnie was raised in central Utah on her family's 500 head commercial cattle and farming operation. She went to school for accounting, but discovered that her passion was ranching. "I grew up on a swather and riding in the mountains. I didn't want to sit behind a desk — my dream was to have a life like my parents — on a ranch with cattle and a little farm ground. We are working on that dream," she echoes Dirk's aspiration to have a ranch of their own.

As a student at Ricks College in Rexburg, Dirk focused his studies on beef production management. After graduation he started his career working on a large commercial ranch in Nevada, managing the heifers at the Utah State University (USU) research farm, as herd manager at USU's dairy center, and then in 2002 started working as herd manager for HD Dunn & Son Angus Ranch, Tetonia, Idaho.

While in Tetonia, Dirk became acquainted with Marnie's father. "In a nutshell, I got to know her family as bull customers even before we started dating," Dirk laughs. They got married while Dirk was still working as herd manager, and building his own SimAngus herd as he worked there.

In 2010, the couple struck out on their own, moving to his parents place and leasing ground. Today, they are in the midst of purchasing his family's property, and plan to continue to lease private ground as well as utilize available BLM land.

"The ranch is a family affair," Marnie states. Dirk and Marnie are the proud parents of five children: Jeslyn, 16; Jauncee, 13; Clay, 7; Dakota, 4; and Tanna, 2. Their two oldest daughters, involved in 4-H and FFA, are active on the ranch. "The kids have been very good help for Dirk and I. As Clay gets older, he has started to enjoy getting involved in the ranch more."

In addition to the cattle operation, the Johnsons raise 350 acres of hay that they feed their herd and an acre of organic garlic. The garlic, a year round selling cash crop, is planted by hand in the fall and harvested by the entire family at the end of summer before the Eastern Idaho State Fair. "We sell at least a third of our crop

at the state fair, but the rest we sell online. We get two to three orders a week that we ship out,"

After the garlic is picked in the field, it gets deposited in their empty sale barn where they sort through seed and culinary grade. Hung to dry, the garlic gets wrapped up in bundles and organized by stall. Dirk laughs, "This is where we utilize our show cattle fans to dry down the fresh garlic for proper storage."

"We also keep our own seed to replant, like the seedstock operations cow herd genetics. We also have different varieties that we offer that we want to keep pure and organic," Marnie explains the parallels of how their gourmet garlic operation, Vertical Edge Garlic, compares to the cattle enterprise.

"It took us a long time to get here," Dirk concludes, reflecting over the past seven years of Vertical Edge Genetics. "We have found where we want to be. We want to raise our family and keep this legacy alive. Our passion for the seedstock cattle industry is strong. One of the most exciting times for SimGenetics is right now."

Hitting the 8 Bull


A breeder utilizes old Simmental bulls in his breeding program.

When Simmental genetics took a major turn, pushing for black, polled, smaller cattle, the semen of the "old school" bulls sat in tanks with less demand. Kevin Voltz has been around Simmental cattle his entire life. His parents began running them in the 70s, and since that time, "new" genetics have not entered their herd. Voltz has been keeping an eye out for old semen for years, and now has a collection of 103 different herd sires.

His latest acquisition, Firn, ASA number 000008, came from a Craigslist find. Voltz periodically searches for semen on several sites including the online garage-

sale style forum and came across a semen tank for sale. The details listed Angus, Maine and other breed semen in the tank and Kevin called to find out the complete details. The seller of the tank acquired it from a retired ABS representative and listed off the bulls. He finally got to a cane containing "SM" labeled straws, immediately piquing Voltz' interest. The ASA registration number read "000008" which is the ASA number for Firn, the eighth Simmental animal ever registered. Kevin recently submitted DNA on the sample with plans of AI'ing some of his females to the traditional Simmental bull.

Prior to finding semen for Firn, the oldest bull in his tank was Gallant, ASA number 000010, the tenth Simmental animal registered. He notes that while calving ease was an issue with older bulls, the bulls he has used haven't presented many issues. The cows are large framed (5.6 to 7.0 frame score), which lends to breeding to these older bulls.

Kevin keeps an impressive spreadsheet with information ranging from gestation length of his cows, to each EPD on bulls with semen in the tank. The spreadsheet also includes information on the heritage of each bull. For example, a cow may trace back to French and Swiss animals. This information goes back several years and offers a detailed perspective on the genetics he has saved.

Voltz points to the difficulty of acquiring historical information on these animals. Searching the Internet typically doesn't yield many results, so he keeps an eye out for magazines and other historical information in print. While the Simmental breed has changed tremendously over the last fifty years, collections like these have preserved the genetics that began the breed. •

Six Elected to Board of Trustees

Michael Forman, Ellensburg, WA



Mike Forman, his wife, Paulette, his son, Robb, and his wife Debbie own and operate Trinity Farms near Ellensburg in Central Washington. Forman's granddaughter, Chelse, has now become an integral part of the team. Their cowherd consists of 700 cows, a majority of which are SimAngus™, along with purebred Simmental and Angus. Since 1986, AI and embryo transfer have been used extensively, utilizing top sires from both the Simmental and Angus breeds. Forman is a past president of both the Washington Simmental Association and Washington Angus Association. An average of 135 bulls, plus approximately 50 open females are sold through their own production sale, held annually on the first Saturday in March. They additionally sell approximately 50 bulls private treaty. At one time, the Formans owned three agricultural tractor dealerships, selling Kubota, Hesston, and other farm equipment. After divesting the dealerships, they formed a construction company, specializing in public works projects. That business was sold when Mike retired, allowing him to spend more time on the cattle ranch. Mike and Paulette also have one other son, Randy.

John Griswold, Stillwater, OK



Griswold Cattle runs registered Simmental, Angus, and Maintainer cows. They hold two annual sales, selling 400 females in December, and 200 bulls and several females each April. Semen is also marketed on herd sires and genetic crosses. Depending on the cattle market, Griswold Cattle feeds steers. Griswold has been involved in many aspects of the business, which shapes his decisions as a seedstock producer. Griswold recently completed a three-year term on the American Maine-Anjou Association Board. Griswold grew up in Wisconsin on a third generation cattle operation. His family sold their farm and came to Oklahoma when John was 17. John graduated from Oklahoma State University, while there he started acquiring cattle that he knew he could make a base out of. As the Simmental breed began to gain momentum in the US, many states formed local associations. These groups held sales, meetings, and events, designed to promote the use of Simmental genetics. By December, 1971, 20 state associations had been established: Texas, Montana, Kentucky, Iowa, Missouri, Georgia, Kansas,

Colorado, Oklahoma, Mississippi, North Dakota, Arkansas, Wyoming, South Dakota, Tennessee, Nebraska, Washington, Ohio, Florida, and Minnesota. Many of these state groups still exist today. Below are a cross-section of representative photos, which appeared in the *Simmental Shield* magazine, documenting the formation of these groups.

Today, Dr. Bert Moore serves as ASA's State Association Liaison. Below, Moore provides insight into the importance of state associations, and how they continue to serve the breed.

"There was interest early and a move afoot prior to the formation of the American Simmental Association to establish a state association in Arkansas with the thought that they might merge with others into a national association. They were actually close to copyrighting a name, preparing bylaws and incorporating. It was agreed at the time that it was

better to have a unified organization rather than several local associations and that merging with other local organizations into a national association was the best way to address the rapidly expanding interests in Simmental cattle. Early meetings of those interested in Simmentals drew crowds well beyond expectations. Denver, Texas and North Dakota are just a few examples where attendance was much greater than the venues for which they were planned.

When state associations were organized they frequently drew on the assistance of ASA Executive Secretary, Don Vaniman, particularly in the area of contact information for interested people. Beef extension personnel, leaders of state beef cattle improvement associations and agricultural university people were also often involved. In many cases though there was one person or a small group of people that proved to be the real "driving force" behind their establishment. At that time there was a great need to educate the public about the breed and the value that they could contribute to the commercial beef industry. Those that helped in the initial organization of state associations contributed greatly to this effort and continue to do so today. State associations are truly the "grass roots" of the ASA. They know and understand the people and the programs that function in their area. The ASA in turn has programs to financially assist in the promotion of the SimGenetic story at the local level through the state associations.

It is well documented that active state associations contribute markedly to the interest and activity of the Simmental business in that state. State associations continue to be essential parts of the Simmental Team as not only a promotional arm but also as an important educational tool in the rapidly expanding information age."


The Value of DNA Information

in the BOLT Single-step Genetic Evaluations

DNA profiles provide additional information about the genetic merit of a DNA tested animal and increase the accuracy of EPDs, which are called Genomic Enhanced EPD or GE-EPDs. In the BOLT single-step process, the DNA marker genotypes are directly incorporated into the genetic evaluation along with the phenotypes (performance data) and the pedigree. As a result, the DNA information has an impact not only on the genotyped individual, but also on all the relatives of that genotyped individual. This allows for the DNA information to improve the accuracy of non-genotyped relatives.

To measure the impact of DNA information on accuracies of GE-EPDs in the BOLT singlestep genetic evaluations, we compared the average BIF accuracies of GE-EPDs of DNA tested young animals (born in 2016 with no progeny) to the average BIF accuracies of nongenotyped sires born in 2010-2014. Only sires with non-genotyped calves were used for this comparison. We found that the average BIF accuracy of GE-EPD for a DNA tested young animal is equivalent to the average BIF accuracy of a non-genotyped sire with 21, 22 and 24 calves with observed phenotypes for birth, weaning and yearling weights, respectively (Figure 1, where a horizontal line cross a curve for a specific trait (e.g. red line and blue curve cross each other at the data point correspond to y(accuracy) = 0.46) and x(progeny) = 21 for birth weight)). The progeny equivalent (PE) for direct calving ease was 15 and it was only 3 for total maternal calving ease due to limited genotypes on cows. The PE for milk and stayability were 18 and 25, respectively (Figure 1).



Are the BOLT EPDs

More Accurate Than Our Previous Cornell EPDs?

The ASA and International Genetic Solution (IGS) partners invested in a new and improved genetic evaluation software called BOLT to replace the Cornell EPD evaluation system. Among other benefits, this enables the use of single-step methods for incorporating genomic information into National Cattle Evaluation (NCE) instead of the blending approach. In the BOLT single-step process, the DNA marker genotypes are directly incorporated into the genetic evaluation along with the phenotypes (performance data) and the pedigree. As a result, the genomic data has an impact not only on the genotyped individual, but also on all the relatives of that genotyped individual. This allows for the genomic information to improve the accuracy of non-genotyped relatives.

The BOLT single-step method squeezes more information from the DNA markers by allowing for certain DNA markers to have a larger influence on predicting the genetic merit of an animal than other DNA markers while some DNA markers to have no effects on trait(s) of interest (for progeny equivalents of select traits, see page 22). This model is closer to what we expect based on biology where some parts of an animal's genome (or

genes) play more important roles than other parts of its genome (or genes). This is unique to the IGS single-step method compared to other organizations where the DNA marker information is used to adjust relationships among the individuals.

Many ASA members and IGS partners wonder if the BOLT EPDs are more accurate than the Cornell derived EPDs in the real world? To answer this question, we performed a validation study where we ran a data set (pedigree, performance, genomics) through both genetic evaluation software (BOLT and Cornell) to compare the accuracies of the EPDs produced. To enable a fair comparison, we removed the performance records of animals born in 2015 and later from the evaluation in both systems to be used as progeny performance records for validation purposes. Table 1 shows the correlations between EPDs and progeny performance of non-genotyped sires evaluated in both systems that have progeny born in 2015 or later with recorded birth, weaning, and yearling weights. As shown, the BOLT EPDs are more accurate than Cornell EPDs as the correlations are higher for BOLT EPDs with sires' progeny performances.

To have a better sense of improvement in accuracies, we ranked sires based on either BOLT or Cornell EPDs for birth, weaning and yearling weights. Then, we compared the progeny performance of the top 1% vs bottom 1% ranked sires for each trait in each evaluation system. The results are shown in Table 2.

As you can see, the BOLT single-step EPDs ranked sires more accurately than EPDs from the Cornell software, where progenies of top 1% ranked sires based on the BOLT EPDs are +3.1, +16.8 and +40.2 lb heavier at birth, weaning and yearling. These results are exciting, and show that our investment in new technology will lead to more accurate EPDs. \blacklozenge



Founding President Passes

Wyoming's Jack Winninger provided early leadership to fledgling organization.

"Jack" Winninger,** 91, passed away November 25, at Long Term Care in Cody, Wyoming, where he had resided since the spring of 2015. Winninger, born and raised in Wyoming, spent his entire life in the Cowboy state except for a three-year hitch in the US Navy during World War II.

When the American Simmental Association was formed on October 14, 1968, Winninger was named to the nine-member founding Board of Trustees, and was subsequently elected to the presidency of the new organization. (Note: In the early years, ASA's highest elected official was the President. In the late 1980s, that position was officially changed to Chairman. Also, the number of Board members was later expanded from nine to 16.)

Other members of that Founding Board were Charles H. "Bud" Dodge, Crystal Lake, Illinois; Dr. Ray Woodward, Bozeman, Montana; Jerry Moore, Canton, Ohio; Jesse Malone, Choteau, Montana; Charles Koch, Cincinnati, Ohio; Pat Wilson, Frostproof, Florida; William Yaw, Galesburg, Illinois; and P. Hubert Hanes, Winston-Salem, North Carolina. Malone ultimately became the second ASA president; and Moore served two consecutive terms as the third president.

Winninger was born to homesteaders Joseph and Mable Winninger, who were then running the YU Ranch on the banks of the Greybull River. After graduation from Cody High School, Jack immediately enlisted in the Navy. After being discharged, he enrolled at the University of Wyoming and earned an agricultural degree in 1949.

That was also the year that he married Joann Thomasson, who would be his wife and companion for the next 68 years. The newly-weds moved to Meeteetse where they established and operated their 14,000-acre ranch.

A progressive rancher, Winninger was active in the Wyoming Stockgrowers Association and the National Cattlemen's Association; and served on the advisory committees of the University of Wyoming College of Agriculture; the Fort Keogh Livestock and Range Station at Miles City, Montana; and the US Meat Animal Research Center, Clay Center, Nebraska.

His ranching operation was prominently featured in such publications as the *Simmental Shield*, the *Farm Journal* and *Successful Farming*. Winninger was a frequent speaker/presenter at regional and national beef production conferences, breed association meetings and university symposiums.

A firm believer in public service, he was elected to the Wyoming State Legislature, served as a county commissioner and as manager of both the Worland and Cody Chambers of Commerce.

Winninger was preceded in death by his sisters Faris Morse, Elizabeth Hitchcock, and Ruth Witherspoon. He is survived by his devoted wife, Joann; two sons: Charles and David; three daughters: Connie Polsley, Mary Hixson and Janet Bolz; 15 grand-children and countless great grandchildren.





Walton-Berry Graduate Student Support Grant

- 2013 Drs. Jennifer Bormann, Bob Weaber, Dan Moser, and Mike MacNeil from Kansas State University. Funds used to support graduate student stipend and living expenses for a collaborative research project in quantitative and molecular genetics in beef cattle at the US Meat Animal Research Center.
- 2014 Dr. Jennifer Thomson, Montana State University. Funds used to study the genetics and objective measurements of temperament in beef cattle.
- **2014** Dr. Stephanie McKay, The University of Vermont. Funds used to characterize the brain methylome in steers with extreme measures of docility.
- 2015 Dr. Heather Huson, Cornell University. Funds used to study the genetics of digital Cushion Thickness and pay travel expenses for graduate students to present research findings at an international conference in Sweden.
- 2015 Dr. Megan Rolfe, Oklahoma State University. Funds used to analyze genetic links to water intake in beef cattle.
- **2016** Dr. Jerry Taylor, University of Missouri. Funds used to identify potentially lethal haplotypes in beef cattle.
- 2017 Dr. Jared Decker, University of Missouri. Funds used for graduate student travel to Beef Improvement Federation meetings and develop extension publications.
- **2017** Drs. Scott Speidel, Milton Thomas, and R. Mark Enns. Funds used to investigate stability genetic predictions using endpoints beyond six years of age.

Since my first year at the ASA, I have had the pleasure and honor of working with the Walton-Berry Graduate Student Support committee. The Walton-Berry Graduate Student Support Grant supports graduate education with an emphasis on genetic improvement of livestock. The fund originally started by Jim Berry of Wildberry Farms, honors Dr. Bob Walton's lifelong efforts in animal breeding and raising Simmental cattle. This grant aims to help train future animal breeders and advance our knowledge of applied livestock genetics. There are two awards - one for \$5,000 and a second for \$3,000 for graduate education programs; each recipient contributes to articles about their research to ASA Publication.

Each Spring, researchers are encouraged to apply for this grant (due April 15). The committee (composed of Steve McGuire, Wade Shafer, Jim Berry, Bob Walton, and myself) reviews the grants and notifies applicants by May 15. 





Idaho Provides Grants to Packer

CS Beef Packers will use \$1.1 million state grant to hire and train 701 new workers for full-time positions at the company's new beef plant in Kuna, Idaho. CS Beef Packers, a joint venture between Texas-based Caviness Beef Packers and Idaho-based agribusiness JR Simplot Co., began operations at the 400,000-square-foot facility in 2017.

The company will pay an average of \$17.28 per hour plus employer assisted medical benefits, according to the state's news release. The company's services include packing, rendering, and tanning hides.

Oklahoma Beef Council Sues Auditing Firm

The Oklahoma Beef Council (OBC) has filed a lawsuit in the District Court of Oklahoma County against Edmond-based accounting firm Arledge & Associates, P.C. The lawsuit relates to the embezzlement of OBC funds by one of its former employees. OBC's management discovered the embezzlement in July 2016, and the employee pled guilty to charges arising from it in May, 2017.

The lawsuit alleges that the accounting firm engaged to perform audits of OBC for fiscal years 2012-2015. For each year audited, Arledge issued clean, unqualified opinions that the financial statements presented fairly, in all material respects, the financial position of OBC.

Oklahoma Checkoff Referendum Fails

A proposal to institute a \$1 per head state checkoff fund for Oklahoma's beef producers was defeated by a vote of 2,505 to 1,998.


The campaign to institute the fee was controversial. Oklahoma members of the Organization for Competitive Market and R-CALF USA had asked the state's Supreme Court to prohibit the department from certifying the Oklahoma beef checkoff program referendum. With the referendum defeated, the lawsuit will be withdrawn.

South Dakota Custom Grazer Sentenced

A rancher in South Dakota has been sentenced to 46 months in prison and must pay back cattle producers after lying about grazing he could offer. In 2007, the accused offered custom grazing through land leased from the Bureau of Indian Affairs on the Lake Traverse Indian Reservation. From 2012-2014, the rancher offered grazing for land he did not have leased.

The accused was found guilty of eight accounts of fraud by a federal jury. In addition to serving four years in prison, the rancher was ordered to pay \$236,000 in restitution to the ranchers he scammed.

EPA to Mandate Renewable Fuels

The Environmental Protection Agency (EPA) will mandate that refiners use 15 billion gallons of conventional renewable fuels — primarily ethanol — next year, according to an EPA official. But, rebuffing pleas from biodiesel producers, the agency is also set to maintain a 2.1 billion-gallon quota for that soy-based fuel in 2019.

The EPA's decision illustrates how the administration is trying to balance the needs of two competing constituencies. Midwest farmers who rely on the mandate to guarantee ethanol demand and oil refiners who insist the requirements are costly, burdensome and impractical.

Beginning Farmers Benefit from Act

The Beginning Farmer and Rancher Opportunity has been introduced in Congress by Representative Tim Walz (D-MN) and Jeff Fortenberry (R-NE). The bill is to ensure that the 2018 farm bill focuses on the future of American agriculture by driving investment toward programs and policies that create opportunities for the next generation of farmers and ranchers.

The average age of today's farmer is 58, and over the course of the next five years, nearly 100 million acres of farmland are predicted to change hands. The bill is designed to expand beginning farmer/rancher access to affordable land; empower producers to succeed in today's agriculture economy, and ensure access to financial capital and crop insurance.

GAO Recommends Checkoff Oversight


The US Government Accountability Office (GAO) has made several recommendations to the USDA for providing better review of subcontracts and display of key documents on program websites. There are 22 federal agriculture research and promotion programs, including the Beef Check-off, funded by a fraction of the sale of each unit of a commodity. In 2016, check-off funds totalled over \$885 million.

GAO found that USDA's Agricultural Marketing Service (AMS) does not consistently review subcontracts, which impairs its ability to prevent misuse of funds.

USDA to Publish School Meal Rules

The USDA has announced it will publish a new School Meal Flexibility Rule designed to make "targeted changes" to standards for meals under the agency's National School Lunch and School Breakfast Programs.

The rule gives school meal plan operators the option to provide flavored, low fat (1%) milk and grants exemptions in 2018-19 for schools having a hard time obtaining grain-rich products acceptable to students.





QSRs Lead Thanksgiving Restaurant Sales

Consumer visits to quick service restaurants (QSRs) helped drive a 6.2% increase in restaurant spending on Thanksgiving and Black Friday. Atlantabased First Data, which analyzed online and brick-and-mortar credit card payments, said more than half of the growth in restaurant sales over the same period one year ago came from QSR sales.

The QSR segment also collected 40% of total restaurant spending with an average check of \$10.90. Casual dining operations registered growth of 17% this year and 27% of spending, with an average bill of \$50.65.

Pasture Land Values Reach New Highs

The average value of US pastureland rose 1.5% in 2017 to \$1,350 per acre, according to the USDA 2017 Land Values Summary. The new values reflects an increase of \$20 per acre from 2016 and a record high since the USDA began keeping records.

By comparison, the average acre of cropland is worth \$4,090, a level relatively unchanged from 2016 and the third highest on record. Pasture values range widely, and the southeastern US now has the highest pasture land values in the country.

Livestock Haulers Get Break on Regs

The Federal Motor Carrier Safety Administration recently tapped the brakes on new rules requiring all truck drivers pull off the road after 11 hours and not return to driving for at least 10 more. The administration announced a three-month deferment for truckers hauling livestock.

The rule change has been criticized by the trucking industry in general, but particularly by drivers hauling livestock.

Cattle on feed up 6%


Cattle and calves on feed for the slaughter market in the United States for feedlots with capacity of 1,000 or more head totaled 11.3 million head, up 6% from the same date in 2016. This was in line with analysts' expectations of a 5.7% bump.

Placements in feedlots during October totaled 2.39 million head, 10% above 2016, and higher than the average analysts expectations of a 7% boost. Net placements were 2.32 million head.

Leading Food Trend List

The Specialty Food Association's Trendspotter Panel has named plant-based foods as the number one trend expected in 2018. The panel draws perspective from retail, food-service, and strategic marketing, and culinary education.

"Trends like sustainability and health are converging in the 2018 trends," said a spokesperson for Specialty Food Association. Algae and other plant-based proteins and products meant to reduce food waste, as well as growth in the use of functional ingredients are predicted to be a part of the trend.

Researchers Link SAD, Vegetarianism

Dutch researchers contend there may be a link between seasonal affective disorder (SAD) and vegetarianism, based on a pilot study. The study noted that SAD often involves recurring depression in autumn or winter, with recovery occurring in spring and summer.

The study found that the number of participants who are vegetarian and suffered from SAD were four times higher than the people suffering from SAD in the normal population.

NC State Develops Heat for Chickens

Researchers at North Carolina State University have developed a practical solar heater for poultry houses.

The scientists developed the low-cost solar heater that warms the air as it passes through a black plastic housing that has been heated by the sun. The system is designed to supplement heat generated in poultry houses using propane-fueled equipment and should reduce overall heating costs at poultry farms.

New Approach to Estimating Methane

Scientists at Penn State University have concluded that current estimates of total livestock methane emissions may rely on outdated factors and do not fully consider feed intake differences in animal diets or the facility used to store manure.

These data gaps lead to large uncertainties in methane emissions figures, the researchers said, noting that just how much gas the animals release is a subject of debate.

New Technique Detects Unwanted Animal Parts

A new technique developed by researchers at the University of British Columbia can identify unwanted animal products in ground beef within minutes. Using laser-equipped spectrometer and statistical analysis, food science students determined with 99% accuracy if ground beef samples contained other animal parts, and could say with 80% accuracy which animal parts were used in what concentration.

This new method can be completed in five minutes. DNA testing has proven efficient and accurate in identifying foreign meat products, but is limiting because it cannot identify offal — hearts, livers, kidneys, and stomachs — mixed in with meat.

Roundtable Unveils Sustainability Tools

The US Roundtable for Sustainable Beef (USRSB) has announced the release of its Sustainability Metrics tool designed to help those who raise, buy and sell beef understand ways to balance and improve their environmental impact and financial bottom line.

The USRSB Sustainability Metrics are a result of two years of work by more than 100 members who participated in the volunteer process that allowed each sector of the beef value chain to oversee its own metric development while receiving feedback from all members. •

Tyson Buys Steak Sandwich Maker

Tyson Foods announced it has purchased Philadelphia-based Original Philly Holdings, a producer of raw and fully cooked Philly-style sandwich steak and cheesesteak appetizer products.

Original Philly Holdings consists of two business units: Original Philly Cheesesteak Company, which manufactures raw Philly Style sandwich steak products, and Philadelphia Pre-Cooked Steak Company.

A&W Canada Funds Research

A&W Canada has donated (\$4 million) to the University of Saskatchewan's Livestock and Forage Centre of Excellence (LFCE) for beef forage research.

The money will fund construction of the Livestock and Food Building, \$2.36 million; create a community outreach and engagement program, \$790,000; and establish a visiting fellowship in One Health research, \$790,000. The building will be completed in early 2018.

Chef'd Meal Kits Expand

Meal kit maker Chef'd has announced it is teaming up with specialty grocery store chain Gelson's Markets to offer its meal kits in a supermarket for the first time. The Gelson's partnership initially will involve one store in Hollywood offering a variety of 12 Chef'd recipes that includes premium proteins, produce, and herbs without additives or preservatives.

Each kit feeds two people, retails for \$24.99 and will be available in their own dedicated cooler in the produce department.



Walmart Strikes Back

Competition for grocery dollars is heating up, and Walmart is not backing down from Amazon's entry into the food business. Walmart has opened its 1,000th online grocery pickup location in the US, and announced expansion of its global online marketplace to Walmart Canada.

The online grocery pickups allow customers to order food products online and then retrieve them at a drive-thru lane at their local store. Food retailers note that the 1,000th Walmart online store was strategically located in Seattle, hometown of the online giant Amazon, which purchased Whole Foods Stores earlier this summer.

Kroger Joins the "Grocerant" Bandwagon

Kroger Co. is adding dining options for customers by opening its first restaurant inside its stores. The company is offering a "fresh take on American comfort food" along with handcrafted cocktails with a family friendly atmosphere.

Kroger — which began offering fresh and ready-to-eat meals in 120 stores in the last year — is the latest grocery chain to establish full-service restaurants inside its stores. The so-called "grocerants" provided alternatives to shoppers who may abandon or postpone their plans to cook at home in favor of dining inside the store.

Smashburger Introduces 'Triple Double'

Smashburger has added a specialty burger featuring two beef patties and three layers of melted cheese to its national menu. The Denver-based restaurant says its new Triple Double burger will feature fresh beef, two slices of American cheese and a single slice of aged cheddar cheese served on a toasted artisan bun.

Customers will be able to customize their burgers with fresh produce, toppings, and condiments at all full-service locations. The company has more than 370 corporate and franchised restaurants in 38 states and in nine countries.

Updated Canadian Cattle ID Import Requirements

The USDA's Animal and Plant Health Inspection Service (APHIS) reports that Canada has updated its ID requirements for breeding cattle entering the country from the US. Effective February 1, 2018, US breeding cattle exported to Canada will need an 840 radiofrequency identification (RFID) tag and a USA tattoo in the right ear.

The USDA metal tag will no longer be accepted as an option for identification of cattle for export to Canada. APHIS notes that US regulations require special procedures for applying an 840 RFID tag to an animal already tagged with official identification.

WTO Rules on Indonesia's Import

The World Trade Organization (WTO) has ruled in favor of the US in a dispute with Indonesia over its complex and opaque import requirements for beef and beef products. The WTO report found that all 18 of Indonesia's import measures challenged by the US were inconsistent with WTO rules and obligations. The ruling marks the end of the WTO dispute settlement process and is expected to open up significant new export opportunities for the US beef industry.

Indonesia is the fourth most populous country in the world, but with per capita beef consumption of only 2.2 pounds, Indonesia has almost unlimited potential to become one of the world's largest beef importing countries. Indonesia is currently the third-largest export market for US beef hearts following Mexico and Hong Kong.

US to Resume Brazil Beef Imports

Brazil is expected to resume beef exports to the US in the first quarter of 2018. Expectations are based on talks with Brazil's federal government. Shipments are expected to resume in the first quarter of 2018, following positive negotiations with the US government.

The US announced the suspension of Brazilian fresh beef imports in June, due to "recurring concerns about safety of the products." Since then, the US has rejected 1.9 million pounds of Brazilian beef, according to the USDA Food Inspection Agency.

China Beef Market Expands Again

Two companies from Belarus have won approval to begin exporting beef to China, according to a report from the region of the former Soviet Union. The two companies received authorization to supply beef in China following talks between Belarus agriculture representatives and Chinese officials, according to Belarusian sources.

China imported an estimated \$2.6 billion worth of beef in 2016. The Belarusian Embassy also signed a cooperation plan with China covering future development of agriculture trade between the two nations. •





THE: BACK TO BASICS

How to Use Reports in Herdbook

The reports function of Herdbook is a tool many Simmental members take advantage of for querying their records. Groups of calves, active dams, EPDs, averages and much more can be accessed by using reports. This service is available to all active members of ASA, and comes with membership and access to Herdbook.org.

To find Reports in Herdbook you must be logged in. Go to "Herd Mgmt", "Reports".



The screen will display "Existing Groups", and "Web Reports". These existing groups are most useful for those enrolled in THE. For example, selecting "2017 Spring THE Females" will only yield results for those dams enrolled in THE. However, calf groups will bring up all reported calves for that season for THE and non-THE members, such as "2017 Born Heifer Calves".

"Web Reports" lists the kinds of default reports that can be generated. For example, "Calf Crop Summary" will list name, registration number, sire, dam, breed, tattoo, actual and adjusted weights, ranks and ratios, EPDs, and other basic data. A "Genetic Summary" will show each animal's genetic defect status (documented in lineage, tested carrier, etc.) in addition to the same data for the sire and dam.

"PDF Reports" generates simpler documents such as pedigrees with EPDs, or a compact animal list, that can be downloaded as PDF reports and either saved to a computer or printed. These cannot be modified like an Excel document.

Using the existing groups and reports can be extremely useful. However, the most powerful function of Reports is the ability to create custom groups of animals, and custom reports, which show only the needed information for the animals in question.

To create a custom group, go to "Herd Mgmt", and choose "Create Group". This initial page shows the simple form for creating a group of animals. Using the birth date range can narrow a calf crop down to animals born within a specific month of year.

To create a more specific group, at the top of the page, click "Toggle Advanced Options".

Custom Group Creation ?* Toggle Advanced Options

This expands the selection criteria to include sex, breeds, Herd ID, birth date range, registered and/or non-registered, and more. At the bottom of the page, the "Additional Criteria" allows for specific selection of animals based on a wider range of fields. For example, to create a group for all animals with birth weights over 90 pounds, the "Field/Table" can be set to "Birth Weight", the "Operator" set to greater than or equal to (" > = "), and the value set to "90". This can be done for specific EPDs, horn/polled status, etc. Three fields can be set, making this tool extremely valuable for selecting replacements or sale animals. If so desired, a report showing only heifer calves with a birth weight under 90 and weaning weight over 600 could be created.



This custom group will now be listed under "Herd Mgmt", "Reports", at the bottom of the list.



Once a custom group of animals is created, which may not be necessary if using THE groups, the next step is to create a custom report. Go to "HerdMgmt" and choose "Create Report. From here, the report can be customized one of two ways:

The first option is to use the "All Available Headers" option. "Actual Data" will list each piece of data that could be reported on for an animal. For example, data like name, ASA number, sex, tattoo, and birth date can be chosen. Data can also be queried about the parents of an animal. As these are chosen, they will appear on the right under "Selected Headers". They can be rearranged, removed, and renamed by using the tools at the bottom of this page.

The second method for choosing data to be listed on a report is the "Visual Data Selector". This displays a complete animal record. Clicking on each piece adds it to the report, at the bottom of the page under "Selected Headers". For example, choosing "Tattoo", "CE" EPD, and "MCE" EPD, will pull reports for selected animals only showing those criteria.

With either option, the custom report will have to be named and saved.

These reports will now show under "Herd Mgmt", "Reports" on the left-hand side under "Custom Reports".

If a list of animals is stored within an Excel file or any other place not in Herdbook, it can be copied and pasted into the "Quick Group". Using the "Inventory" option allows THE members to pull lists of animals meeting performance advocate requirements.

Once a "Web Report" is generated, it can be downloaded in several formats. A Microsoft Excel file can be accessed from most computers, but if the file will not download or open, choose "Plain Text". This format can be opened by many types of programs. •

Need Registrations or Transfers in a Hurry? Use Our Online Herdbook

Herdbook Services offers hands-on registration capabilities.

You enter the data, work through any errors, pay the fees; registration will be completed in minutes. No priority handling fee, no hold-ups (unless there are errors or payment is needed) and can be completed any time of the day or night.

Interesting fact:

90.8% of the animal data is already submitted electronically through Herdbook Services!

Why the encouragement to go online and register the animal yourself?

- 1. To avoid the priority handling processing fee. This fee will increase to \$50 starting **March 1**, but why pay this fee when you can go online and complete the work yourself?
- 2. Complete the registration online and if you need it mailed by FedEx or UPS send a request via email (simmental@simmgene.com) for special shipping. **Note:** there is a charge for shipping unless mailed by regular US Mail. Plan ahead and avoid those charges.

Need more encouragement to register online?

- Normal processing (registration) on paper applications for SimGenetic animals (once received in the ASA office): 3-7 business days (error-free and payment received) depending on the time of year — holiday season could extend longer.
- 2. Mailing services: within three days of processing (registration) plus the length of time for the US Mail service.

The Customer Service Specialists are just a phone call away to assist you.

- 1. There are peak times and days where there are large volumes of calls (especially as it closes in on a deadline, you are not alone if you are one who waits until the last minute).
- 2. If you are unable to get through, feel comfortable leaving a voicemail. Our goal is to return calls as soon as possible, normally within 3-4 hours. If your question can be answered by email, send an email instead of a voice message to:

To help you plan, here are some items which may hold up registration for a length of time:

- 1. DNA / Genetic Abnormalities / Parental Validation / AI Sire / ET Requirements: DNA Testing is a standard process without any options to expedite this service.
 - a. Normal DNA Testing: 3-4 weeks for results.

 Disqualification or resampling will take longer.
 - b. DNA kit paperwork requests: 48-hour turnaround
 - c. DNA kits mailed out daily
 - d. Results uploaded daily as they become available from GeneSeek

2. Non-Compliance:

Total Herd Enrollment breeders: there is a deadline each year where the previous year's calf data or a reason why no calf data was reported must be submitted. You'll be notified of the dams in your herd which need additional information when you go on-line to submit new registrations. Until this information is completed, no new data will be accepted.

3. Foundation Registration:

Sires registered with other breed associations MUST be registered with ASA prior to registering progeny. Other breed dams may be registered with ASA as Foundation, but it is optional, not mandatory. Normal processing 10-12 business days (errorfree, payment received, DNA requirements completed).

4. Breeder Signature:

The owner of the dam at the time of conception is required to sign as breeder. If the applicant and breeder are different, make sure you have breeder's signature on the calf's registration application or breeding information is supplied on the transfer of the dam. If it was sold with calf at side, make sure the seller has registered and transferred the calf to you.

5. Non-payment:

Payment is required to complete registrations.



Priority Handling Processing Service:

ASA offers priority handling services if you are unable to complete your registration online. If the data is error-free and payment is received, normal turn-

around time for registration is within two business days. There is a priority handling processing fee \$50 per animal. Regular US Mail service is at no charge, however, other mailing services (i.e. FedEx, UPS or Express Mail) will incur additional charges.



Incentives for Cooperators

- Free semen from the industries top herd sire prospects
- ♦ All cows in herd will be put in ASA's database which will provide EPDs for every female. This allows you to make selection and culling decisions within the cowherd based on EPDs.
- ♦ You have the option to retain all or some of the females produced from the program
- ◆ ASA will pay \$60/AI sired carcass that is harvested
- ♦ Cooperators will get carcass data back on all the calves harvested through the program.
- ♦ A portion of the CMP calves have feed intake collected and records shared with the cooperators.

How does it work?

- ♦ ASA assigns all matings in a random fashion so that the test produces unbiased, accurate results.
- ♦ ASA will work to provide bulls that fit the general criteria of your herd. However ASA must use only bulls that are enrollled in the program.
- ◆ At least two sires will be used per contemporary group and ASA likely will use several sires per contemporary group to provide better more accurate test results.
