





VIEWPOINT

We are headed toward the 50th anniversary of the American Simmental Association in 2018 and if you attended the Annual Meeting you heard reports from the various committees concerning our current status as a breed association. It is difficult to determine if we have made any progress unless you review the

past and then you must determine what is progress.

So let's look at what has transpired since 1999 and then you determine if we have made progress.

Total membership 1999: 10,837 both Adult and Junior Total membership 2016: 7,126 both Adult and Junior

Total income 1999: \$2,014,053.85 Total income 2016: \$4,275,913.00

Total expenses 1999: \$1,994,803.53 Total expenses 2016: \$3,333,994.00

Total registrations 1999: 18,275 Total registrations 2016: 75,075

Total transfers 1999: 9,532 Total transfers 2016: 34,332

1999 carcass merit program was collecting its first carcass data

2016 feed intake was added to the carcass merit program

1999 SimConference meeting was held.

2016 Fall Focus meetings were held for the third year.

1999 our genetic evaluation using some genetically enhanced data was two years old and was being run by Cornell University.

2016 Operation Quantum Leap, the first dramatic change in our genetic evaluation software, had been running for two years.

2016 ran the first genetic evaluation on the world's largest data set on "single step".

— December 2016 the next generation software, BOLT, Biometric Open Language Tools, produced the first run producing new figures for Stayability for all cattle in the system. The full release of BOLT for all traits is expected in 2017, making our EPDs the largest database run on a single step system.

— 2016 saw our AJSA program explode with record numbers of AJSA Members participating in Regional Classics and the National Classic with some 500 AJSA members exhibiting 500 plus animals at the National Classic as well as participating in all the other educational portions of this program.

— 2016 also saw the first Steer Profitability Competition for the youth, giving our AJSA program a new dimension of the real world cattle business and broadened the scope for those that want to be a part of this great association of youth.

1999 the ASA office was in a 30-year-old building 2016 a new ASA Office was dedicated and is completely paid for.

If you just look at the figures, many of you will say that everything is great with the American Simmental Association and I must admit that they show a very positive picture; so what prompted this growth?

It started with staff and your Board of Trustees in 1999; when cash was short, registrations were on the decline and our cattle were not meeting the needs of the industry. IT WAS CALLED "FOCUS 2000". A collaborative effort where staff, industry leaders and researchers met in Kansas City to change the course of our breed and thankfully the membership bought in and started the work to do the job. It was not a very popular item at the time. It, coupled with the annual service fee, drove some of our members away, but those that stayed answered the challenge and I congratulate each of you for what you have done.

So is everything coming up roses? I would venture to say that if you ask breeders in the Midwest and West you would get a big yes to that question. But if you would ask the same question in the South and East you will get an answer that is not quite so positive.

So how do we move forward?

- Member services must be increased.
- Our programs must be all inclusive regardless of what segment you represent in the breed.
- We must continue to keep our cattle balanced and not trend to far from the center, in either direction, and structural soundness must be kept as one of the major selection tools.
- As with all businesses, financial strength is key to success so we must remain vigilant in keeping our assets and making sure they grow to allow our programs to continue in times where cash flow may decline.
- A commitment to our youth must be strengthened with both funds and staff.
- Our genetic evaluations must keep pace with the ever-changing industry and new technology.
- Our strongest component is our membership and they must stay focused on building a larger market share for our genetics as well as providing leadership in our decision making process.

You, the ASA membership own the company so become involved and be a part of the future.



From the Ground Up

A performance driven South Dakota seedstock rancher builds a legacy for the next generation.

hen he purchased his first Simmental at the age of 12, Mike Stavick of Veblen, South Dakota, knew that he wanted to be in the cattle industry. He recalls, "Anytime I got the opportunity to work cattle growing up, I would be out there Aling or branding."

Today, he is the owner and manager of M/S Stavick Simmentals, a growing 240 head SimAngus™ ranch he established after years of building the groundwork for a successful enterprise. Stavick explains, "I always knew that I wanted to raise cattle, but it's difficult to make that leap when you're working for someone else, trying to put the finances and collateral together to make it on your own. It's not like stepping into an established family operation."

Located on the Coteau Hills, a plateau that butts up against the Red River Valley, the Stavick's 2,500-acre ranch straddles the line between wild Dakota grassland and productive farmland. As a first generation rancher, Stavick tracks herd data and implements a progressive breeding program to make his operation a profitable and growing enterprise for the next generation.

Meeting the needs of his customers, Stavick focuses on tracking and breeding for performance traits. He elaborates, "I hear from customers that they appreciate that we keep detailed records on our cattle. Our customers are commercial breeders that want as much performance as they can get from their calves. They want rapid growth, big calves at weaning time, and when they put them in their feedlot, they want calves that gain four plus pounds per day with frame. My customers are absolutely performance driven, and so are we."

Since the inception of the program, M/S Stavick Simmentals has qualified as an ASA Performance Advocate (PA), recognizing breeders who consistently submit data on six different traits: calving ease, birth weight, weaning weight, yearling weight, and ultrasound data.

Stavick weighs all bulls every 30 days to manage rate of gain, and to analyze how each bull fits in their contemporary group. "We are constantly crunching data, trying to put out the best genetics possible. If an animal isn't performing to our standard, we remove it right away," he says.

"Maternal qualities, average daily gain, and feed conversions are all really strong traits in the Simmental breed," Stavick points out, recognizing trends favoring SimAngus bulls. "We breed SimAngus, Simmental, Black Angus or Red Angus composite. We maintain a five-eighths or three-quarter blood percentage with our calves, and our customers appreciate what that percentage is offering in their own herds."

Along with performance and EPD qualities, Stavick breeds for animal soundness and docility. He adds, "We are very involved in breeding for better EPDs, but we don't forget about structure and convenience traits like disposition, polledness, carcass traits — the actual performance of the animal."

To market their yearling bulls, M/S Stavick Simmentals use a five star system that reflects ASA's docility scoring. Stavick expounds, "We are around our cattle 365 days a year — we know their personalities, we know their characteristics — if there is a bull that scores a four or five in docility, it gets banded immediately. We want our customers to be comfortable with the animals they purchase from us. They know he isn't going to give them problems."

For Stavick, performance starts with the cowherd. Each cow has to calve in 365-day calving interval, unassisted, and wean a large calf. He states, "Every animal has to perform, has to be profitable, or it's gone. We sell all of our cows that end up open or give us any issue."

He laughs as he retells the anecdote he shared with his children when they were younger, "I told my kids that all animals end up at McDonalds. I explained that if their cows came up open, she was gone. I wanted them to realize the cows purpose — if she doesn't breed, she is gone — if she loses a calf, she is gone. No exceptions."

When asked about his breeding and herd management philosophies, Stavick credits many people he has worked with over the years. He recounts, "A wise old cowboy at my first job taught me a good lesson, 'If you keep a cow that lost a calf or came in open, she will always lose another calf before you sell her. If she loses two calves, there is no way that she ever made you any money. So take your first loss, and be done with it."

If a heifer loses her calf, Stavick pulls a calf off a mature cow and grafts it onto the heifer so she can stay in the herd. If a cow does not nurse a calf through the summer, it will not be kept. "Her option is to either adopt or go to McDonalds," he summarizes.

Hands-on Management

Stavick and Yogo, the family blue healer, primarily handle the day-to-day ranch labor. Stavick describes his philosophy on cattle management in conjunction with

teaching his children livestock management, "Over the years, I have stressed to my kids that our cows are a 365-day-a-year job. We are out looking at them every single day. If there is a problem in our herd, it has only been there for 12 hours, and it gets handled immediately. We are very intense in our management."


Calving takes place in two waves. The heifers calve around January 15 each year, and they are wrapped up in early February by the bull sale. The cows begin the second wave of calving right after the sale. Describing calving season, Stavick puts emphasis on calf vigor, "Space is limited in the barn. Turn around after calving is six to 10 hours. The calf has to be able to follow that cow out to pasture and stay with her — get-up-and-go is important."

At the end of April and beginning of May, heifers and cows are synchronized and bred AI. Then clean up bulls are turned out for 30 days after AIing. The cows are moved to grass from May to the middle of November. By September 1st all calves are weaned, and the heifers that aren't being retained are sold private treaty around the middle of October. Stavick says, "People start calling for heifers around then. So they sell pretty fast. Typically, we sell about 60 heifers for breeding and 60 feeder cattle by the first of the year and our bulls continue to be developed all the way along, until the sale."

On the first Thursday of every February for the last 17 years, M/S Stavick Simmentals have held their King of the Range bull sale. This year, they consigned 75 bulls. They also have a sale in Aberdeen, SD, with Aberdeen Livestock.

Additionally, they sell select bred and open heifers at the North Dakota and South Dakota Simmental Sale, and then sell the rest private treaty.



First Generation Rancher

Stavick was exposed to cattle as a youth by his father, Cliff, who owned a filling station in Britton, SD, and ran cattle on shares with other ranchers. His introduction to the cattle industry was fostered through helping friends manage their cattle. As a student at the University of Minnesota at Crooksten, Stavick focused his studies on Animal Science and Animal Production. After graduation, he started his career in the cattle industry by managing a cow-calf operation, a feedlot, and then working under Jim and Emmet Butcher at Gateway Simmentals along with Rob Fisher of Mountain View Simmental, in Lewistown, Montana.

It was through the Butcher family that Mike met his wife, Myra. At the time, Myra was working as a teacher in a one-room school in Maiden Canyon. Lynn Butcher set the two up on a blind date. Similar to his father, Stavick ran cattle on shares with ranchers he had developed relationships with over the years. After Stavick's father passed away, Mike and Myra moved back to South Dakota, and brought their Simmental cattle with them to Veblen. He clarifies, "Essentially, I had a small herd follow me over the years to where we are now."

He accepted the position of Production Manager for Prairie Ridge Dairy, a 30,000-head dairy in Veblen, and Myra started working as a Kindergarten teacher in Britton, a 30-mile commute from their home. "When we moved, we didn't have enough cattle to make it viable, so I took a job breeding dairy heifers on grass with Prairie Ridge. Over the years, I learned the intense nature of production

agriculture and moved up in the company," he elaborates

For 15 years, Stavick managed the dairy, but when it switched hands six years ago he decided it was time to make the move to full-time ranching. During the transition, the herd was initially expanded by an additional 70 cows, and has grown through heifer retention to the 240 head that are run today.

Along with the growing herd, the ranch has expanded in acreage, he says, "We have been lucky enough to put together a good sized chunk of land — all the acres that we own and rent are in one location. We don't have to haul any cattle."

Farming is limited to 100 acres of silage. Stavick noted that many operations split their time between ranching and farming, but their operation is focused on ranching. "I have seen some people get thin in their management because they are trying to do too many things. I want to specialize in raising seedstock Simmental bulls. Our niche — our enterprise — is in cattle, and we try to focus our attention on that," he shares.

Both of Stavick's children, Liv, 20, and Owen, 19, remain as involved in the operation as they can while attending college. Currently, Liv studies Political Science and Ag Business at Montana State University in Bozeman. She comes home to help every chance she gets, especially around the holidays, and every February for the bull sale. Owen double majors in Ranch Management and Large Animal Veterinarian Technician at Lake Area Tech in Watertown, and comes home every weekend to help his father.

Recently, a new calving and breeding barn was built in anticipation of expanding the herd to 300 – 400 cows. Stavick explains his focus on growing the herd toward Owen's interest in taking over the ranch someday, "Both Owen and Liv are a great help with ranch work when they are home from school. Owen is no doubt the reason I am pushing the ranch forward. If he wasn't deciding to come back to the ranch after school, I think I would be content to run 180 to 200 head — stay where I am — but he has definitely shown an interest. He loves cattle, like I do, and he wants to come back."

The excitement surrounding SimGenetics continues to build and I am proud, Mr. Chairman, to present the Treasurer's report for fiscal year ending June 30, 2016, which reflects the financial status of the American Simmental Association (ASA), ASA Publication, Inc. and the American Simmental/Simbrah Foundation. The consolidated Financial Statement completed by Rudd & Company is posted on ASA's website.

It has been an honor and pleasure to serve as Treasurer again this year and I would like to sincerely thank staff members, Linda Kesler and Wade Shafer, for their devoted assistance in addition to Finance Committee members, Mike Forman, Erika Kenner, Brian DeFreese, and Dale Miller. I would also like to thank the ASA Publication Board, under the leadership of Brian DeFreese, for their dedication and continuous effort of maintaining ASA Publication Inc. as a self-sustaining organization.

Total revenue for ASA for fiscal year 2016 is \$4,380,198. Operating revenue of ASA membership fees, registration income, transfers and Total Herd Enrollment income totaled \$3,240,313 in fiscal year 2016, compared to \$2,858,403 in 2015. An increase of \$381,910 was realized from these sources the past year.

ASA Publication, Inc. had total operating revenue of \$1,216,963 for fiscal year 2016 as compared to operating revenue of \$1,198,830 for 2015, showing an increase of \$18,133.

Consolidated total operating revenue for 2016 was \$5,243,765 compared to \$4,735,558 for 2015. This shows an increase of \$508,207 over 2015. The consolidated overall operating expenses for 2016 were \$4,382,752 compared to \$3,902,256 in 2015. This is an increase in overall expenses of \$480,496. Our consolidated total net asset is \$10,915,020, which is an increase from fiscal year 2015 of \$1,494,650.

For 2016, investments for the ASA remained with Vanguard. The Association and Foundation maintain investments with a financial institution under the management of third parties in accordance with its investment policy. Fair value at June 30, 2016 was \$5,829,722. Currently all interest and dividends from the investments are reinvested. The ASA Board of Trustees previously approved expenditure of funds from the CD's and Savings Accounts for building ASA's new headquarters; however, no Vanguard funds were used. As reported last year, the Board approved the use of a loan in 2015 to pay for the remainder of the new ASA Headquarters instead of using funds from our Vanguard investments. In fiscal year 2016, the Board paid the remaining expenses associated with the new ASA Headquarters in the amount of \$345,000 from the loan. The construction of the new ASA Headquarters is completed and within budget. At the end of the 2016 Fiscal Year the balance due on the loan was \$315,000. The ASA Trustees and staff are very proud to

The tract of land owned by the ASA located at 1 Simmental Way is currently on the market. The proposed change of use on the land has been granted by the city and is now zoned B-2, Community Business District, which should prove to be more appealing to potential buyers. The North 19th ingress and egress entitlement for the property is currently in process and will hopefully be finalized in the near future. The application is under review by the Montana Department of Transportation. We have support from the Bozeman City Commissioners and Bozeman Fire Chief; hopefully, this will be enough to convince the Montana Department of Transportation to approve our application for access off North 19th.

We are in excellent financial shape and I am pleased to let you know that although we are conservative in our expenditures, all ASA-supported programs are progressing strongly and with completion and payment in full of the new building and land, in addition to the finalization of legal matters concerning the Patent Challenge, the Board is eager to explore new opportunities for the American Simmental Association.

Breed Improvement Committee

2016 has been a very busy year for the Breed Improvement Committee (BIC) members, and listed below are the major accomplishments:

"Red Charlie": In April, the committee learned of a new red coat color variant discovered by Dr. Claire Gill, Texas A&M University, named "Red Charlie". A DNA test has been developed and added to the Herdbook/TraitTrac system. Dr. Jackie Atkins has taken the lead on this and will continue to work with and educate our membership about this variant.

Two DNA Labs Discussion: The BIC was asked by membership to look into the possibilities of using two DNA labs. Informative presentations by staff members Dr. Jackie Atkins and Leoma Wells were given to the BIC and the full Board. From these discussions, it was decided that using one lab was the most efficient and cost effective. By using economies of scale, ASA Staff presented to the Executive Committee, a new lower fee schedule from GeneSeek. The Executive Committee accepted the new fee schedule. DNA staff will continue to work with DNA labs in an effort to provide the most up-to-date and cost effective genetic tests to end users.

BOLT Software/Theta-Solutions: In early 2016, the Board considered purchasing an interest in Theta-Solutions LLC. Through legal counsel, discussions took place for several months until August when the BIC recommended to the Board to enter into a Five-Year Subscription Agreement at \$65,000 per year at which time the ASA would become fully vested and no further payments would need to be made. Motion passed. Staff is working to release new Multi-Breed GE-EPD's using BOLT software in the next run.

Carcass Merit Program (CMP) 2016: Twenty-four bulls entered into the CMP in 2016 with 5 PB Simmentals and 19 SimAngus™. These numbers were lower than previous years as 2016 saw an unexpected reduction in the number of females available in the CMP cooperator herds. Over the last months, the ASA recruited several new cooperator herds for the 2017-breeding season and we anticipate building up the number of bulls tested next year. In 2016, the ASA added over 400 carcass records on progeny from the 2014-enrolled bulls and nearly 1,000 birth-throughweaning records on the 2015-enrolled bulls.

More than 300 individual feed intake records and DNA samples were collected on CMP calves in 2016 (from the 2014 enrolled bulls) and we are gearing up to collect more on the 2016-born calves (from the 2015-enrolled bulls). Collecting individual feed intake record phenotypes and genotypes will add accuracy to the genetic evaluation for dry matter intake, a very important economically relevant trait. This project will enable more accurate selection for profitable and sustainable beef production.

Feed Intake and/or carcass data: To continue to validate GE-EPDs now and in the future, ASA values feed intake and/or carcass data. In order to provide incentive, the BIC recommended to the Board to provide a 50% price discount on an LD genomic test per each animal on which an ASA member provides feed intake/or carcass data. Resolution passed. Check with staff on exact requirements.

IGS as an LLC: The BIC, staff and legal counsel did extensive research into pros and cons of splitting IGS off from the ASA into a separate LLC. After many presentations and much discussion, it was decided that would not be in the best interest of ASA members and IGS partners at this time.

Feeder Profit Calculator (FPC): With the patent challenge behind us, BIC recommended to the Board that upon approval of IGS partners, to direct staff to launch the Feeder Profit Calculator (FPC). Directive passed and FPC will be introduced to the industry at the upcoming NCBA convention in Nashville.

USDA Beef Grading Update: The BIC recommended to the Board to direct staff to draft a letter in support of the USDA research into updating the current carcass grading system. Directive passed.

Indexes: During the 2016 Fall Focus, in Bozeman, MT, the membership expressed concern over the \$API and \$TI indexes. The BIC requested that ASA Chairman Dale Miller (Continued on page 24)

appoint an ad hoc committee to fully investigate the need for a new index. Committee members Clay Lassle, Chairman; Tim Curran, John Irvine, Willie Altenburg, Marty Ropp and Dr. Wade Shafer spent many hours researching reference materials and discussing if there was a need for a new index. Examining where use of current indexes has taken the population provided insight as to their relevance now and into the future. What became clear was that having time to study data, research documents and trends without the time restraints of a Board meeting were very and led to great discussions. The Index committee has determined and reported back to the BIC the following:

- 1. No need for an additional index
- 2. Need to focus on collection of more data in order to refine existing indexes
- 3. Current basic structure is solid but future GE-EPDs will require adjustments and refinements
- 4. Education is required to help breeders understand and use. Possibly a Fall Focus panel discussion

The BIC would like to thank the ad hoc committee members and staff for their time and expertise in researching this question.

On a personal note, I would like to thank the members of the BIC and staff for their work on all the issues of 2016. The membership should be proud of their dedication to the responsibility they have given to the task of deciding Breed Improving issues.

The A&E Committee began their work for 2016, in Denver with the appointment of new committee members and a new chairman. We have been very active during the year and I would like to thank the committee members and staff for all the time and effort spent to make this a very special year for A&E.

A&E Committee members wear many hats, as their responsibilities are outlined in the Rules and Bylaws: overseeing the Chairman's Reception at the Annual Meeting, helping organize the Foundation auction, the Fall Focus, PTP shows, maintaining a PTP approved judge list for PTP shows around the country, AJSA events and activities, the Meet and Greet at the National Western, and the rotation of the National shows and conjoining events

One of the most important events sponsored by this committee was the strategic planning session with the AJSA Board of Trustees held in April 2016, at Bozeman Montana. The session was prompted by AJSA Board members on how to retain AJSA members after they age out of the AJSA. It was the first time in many years, that the AJSA Board has met with the A&E Committee to discuss the direction of the AJSA program and it allowed the junior board members to set in on the senior board meetings and the A&E Committee to see how the process actually works and for them to have the ability to interact with committee members and the entire senior board.

Prior to the strategic planning session, the senior board and junior board completed a questionnaire on prioritizing the needs to advance the junior program. Chip Kemp compiled the results and then they were given to the facilitator, Dr. Bryon Wiegand, to prepare for the Strategic Planning Session.

It was a very fulfilling session with several items being discussed; but the most important item was the creation of a Steer Feed-out project for the AJSA members. Chip Kemp, Dr. Wiegand, Emily Lochner, Jackie Atkins and ASA board member John Irvine went to work and with the help of Chappell Feed Yards, some 60 + head of steers are now on feed using the feed intake system at Chappell feed yards and these cattle will follow the basic guidelines of our Carcass Merit Program (CMP). Both AJSA Board members and the ASA Trustees believe that this meeting with the juniors achieved many things more importantly the Junior Board members now have a clearer understanding of how the process works at the ASA Board level. As a result of the meeting, the ASA Board approved the recommendation from the A&E Committee to include the current AJSA president as a non-voting member of the A&E committee.

Another major undertaking was the revision of the rules for the AJSA Regional and National Classic, which have not been changed drastically since these events first started. The AJSA Board, with the guidance of Emily Lochner, brought a host of changes that the ASA Board voted on so these changes will go into effect in 2017.

The 2016 regionals and National Classic were huge successes, with record-breaking numbers of AJSA members attending and exhibiting animals. The National Classic, held in Des Moines, Iowa, broke every record with largest number of Simmental, Simbrah and SimAngus ever shown at a National Classic. It was by all accounts a huge success and thanks need to go to the Iowa Simmental Association and friends along with staff that made this a huge success. With more than 500 AJSA members exhibiting nearly 700 animals, it was the largest National Classic to date.



The NAILE PTP show had the largest number of cattle ever entered with nearly 1,000 Simmental and SimAngus that were evaluated by approved PTP judges.

Fall Focus 2016 was a huge success and was held in Bozeman, Montana, in conjunction with the Grand Opening of the ASA new headquarters, located at One Genetics Way. Nearly 200 attended this event from throughout the US and Canada. Bill McDonald did an excellent job raising funds to help support this event as he has done over the last several years. Thanks to Jackie Atkins and staff for designing a super program centered on how genetics continues to impact the future of the Simmental breed with emphasis being placed on the next generation of genetic evaluation, BOLT.

Plans for 2017 activities include a major revision of the Chairman's Reception and Foundation Auction in Denver; so make plans to attend and help us honor past and present trustees, our retiring Chairman of the Board, Golden Book award recipients and a special recognition of past members of the American Simmental Simbrah Foundation Board. Bidding this year can be done online with Live-Auctions.com and Jered Shipman will again be the auctioneer. We are grateful to the ASA Foundation Board Members who have worked tirelessly on this event — thank you for your hard work.

Growth & Development Committee

The Growth & Development Committee (G&D) and ASA staff have been diligently working to hone our industry outreach efforts.

The Promotional and Advertising budget reflects a targeted approach to a robust, yet fiscally prudent campaign of brand awareness, content and programmatic highlights, and collaborative efforts. Highly focused National advertising, strategically placed regional advertising, editorial and educational articles, social media platforms and highly produced video resources provide

ASA and its membership a cost effective, cohesive, yet tailored promotional campaign. Many of the ads and videos can be accessed at Simmental.org. We encourage membership to view and use them where appropriate. Chip Kemp is the ASA staff contact for ASA promotions.

Additionally, the G&D and the entire Board of Trustees (board) chose to continue to allocate a significant investment towards the success of the Carcass Merit Program (CMP) and the capture of feed intake data. G&D chose to contribute \$20,000 toward this program held in conjunction with Chappell Feedlot in Chappell, NE. The ability to capture extremely valuable feed efficiency information through Chappell's GrowSafe system is a crucial step in continuing to define feedlot profitability and to enhance the value of SimGenetics industry wide. Additionally, G&D chose to maintain the current enrollment fee for the CMP at \$1,500 per bull. This incentivizes continued participation and future expansion of the CMP program. Jackie Atkins is the ASA staff contact regarding the CMP program.

G&D has taken bold steps to grow the use of State Association Cost Share Dollars for state level advertising. At the encouragement of ASA staff, the G&D and the board approved an increase in the Cost Share budget of \$10,000 for 2017. States that use 100% of their 2016 Cost Share allotment can apply for an additional \$1,000 of Cost Share monies in 2017. Bert Moore is the ASA staff contact for State Associations.

There are many other examples of ASA outreach efforts. One example is the assembly of brief information packets for new ASA members and nonmember buyers of SimGenetics. Another novel outreach program is a pilot project in conjunction with the Missouri Cattlemen's Association to highlight ASA's THE-Commercial Option to commercial producers. If successful, this effort may be replicated in other states in coming years. Luke Bowman is a new addition to ASA staff and will be deeply involved with the promotion of SimGenetics. ASA staff directly involved in ASA's outreach efforts include: Jackie Atkins, Luke Bowman, Chip Kemp, Bert Moore, and Bill Zimmerman.

I want to thank the ASA staff for all the support they give the Growth & Development Committee members. We often ask a lot from them and, of course, always need it "right away". The staff has always come through for us. Thanks guys!

Policies & Procedures

According to the Bylaws, this committee is responsible for the aspects of Association life that require an interpretation of policy or procedural questions or the formulation of proposals that will have a bearing on the membership of this Association. One of the first items on the committee's agenda in 2016 was to make sure the responsibilities and consequences of authorized representatives were more clearly known to members. Bylaw Section 2 covers the rules around Authorized Representatives. The committee directed Staff to post the "Things to know about Authorized Reps" on the website next to the Membership Application and to publish periodically in *the Register* magazine.

Several other bylaws and rules were discussed, and after discussion it was concluded that changes were not needed. The committee is regularly discussing scenarios that pertain to the bylaws and oftentimes, it is decided that the current bylaw is correct; however, sometimes we feel a change is needed.

One change is proposed at this Annual Meeting and pertains to how a vacancy is filled on the Board of Directors. In Bylaw Section 4: Subsection B: Part 4 the new bylaw will read if passed by the membership:

In the case a Board member can't fulfill his/her position, the Board may appoint a successor until the next election cycle, at which point a special election would be held to fulfill the remainder of the term. The Special Election would not count as the consecutive regular term. Historically, the Board appointed successor fulfilled the entire balance of the term vacant. This change will allow the members to decide a successor.

The committee also asked the staff to make sure the ballots were clearer regarding the explanations of how members can vote at the Annual Meeting. There was confusion regarding the electronic votes at the last Annual Meeting.

One resolution brought to the full Board for approval from this committee changes how cattle are considered when imported from Canada to the US. It was passed in Committee and by the Board to eliminate the need for an affidavit if the animal is already classified as a Fullblood in Canada. It will automatically be classified as a Fullblood in the US.

Another issue the committee is monitoring is the use of THE Option C. There has been lengthy discussion of members using Option C and selling animals to members without registration papers. Currently, it is not a serious problem, but the committee will continue to monitor it.

Many other items were discussed with no action taken. The committee will continue to examine more bylaws, rules and policies in 2017 to make sure they are current with the times.

Mr. Chairman this concludes our report and I move that it be accepted into the Official Minutes of the 49th Annual Meeting.

Simbrah Committee

The objective of the Simbrah committee is to review policies, rules, regulations, activities, promotional methods and materials that pertain to the Simbrah breed and to make recommendations to the ASA Board of Trustees.

Early in 2016, the Simbrah committee was the impetus for ASA's new 50% discount on low-density genotyping in exchange for feed intake or carcass data. This is a powerful step forward to incentivize the capture of hard to collect phenotypes. It has a direct benefit to our membership in the way of reducing DNA costs and adds strength to the core mission of genetic evaluation by encouraging feed intake and carcass information.

Due in large part to the encouragement of Simbrah committee member Tim Smith, there are currently over 100 SimGenetics bulls on test at the Genetic Development Center in Navasota, TX. Over 40 of those bulls are Simbrah and many other bulls are slick-haired Simmental influenced bulls suited for harsher climates. This is a significant opportunity for Simbrah genetics. The sale will take place in March 2017.

In addition to those direct Simbrah responsibilities, this committee also focuses in a larger sense on ASA's robust lineup of heat tolerant, fescue tolerant, and disease resistant cattle. This group of cattle reflects those genetics that are adaptable to various challenging climates associated with added heat and humidity. As such, at the request of the Simbrah committee, ASA staff generated two new advertisements to highlight the wide array of heat tolerant, fescue tolerant, disease resistant cattle within the ASA database.

Mr. Chairman this concludes my report for the Simbrah Committee and I moved that it be accepted in the Minutes of the $49^{\hbox{th}}$ Annual Meeting.



Trustee Election Process

Trustees review applications and select the candidate or candidates to replace outgoing Trustees by Region.

Nomination ballots are mailed to active adult members announcing the Board nominees and the number of positions open in each of the four regions: Western, North Central, South Central, and Eastern

Active adult members may select the Board Nominee or write in a candidate. Write-in candidates must receive 10 or more votes to be placed on the election ballot. In the event that more than two candidates receive 10 votes, the candidate with the highest number of votes will be placed on the election ballot.

No more than two Board members may reside in any one State.

Thanks again for allowing me to serve as a trustee from the Western region. It truly has been a blessing and rewarding for me to be able to hold this position.



- ◆ ASA will pay \$60/AI sired carcass that is harvested
- ◆ Cooperators will get carcass data back on all the calves harvested through the program.






Perry Thomas, Bismarck, North Dakota

It's Been A Year

It was a little less than a year ago when I accepted my position with the American Simmental Association. Looking back now, it's been the fastest year ever. From hosting the largest National Classic in history, to launching a feedlot steer program in less than six months, to joining forces with other junior breed associations, the AJSA is trending — upwards!

Upon taking the ASA job, I remember thinking "I am going to keep an open mind this first year." I

wanted to heed to the way operations had normally run, but I also wanted to leverage my "strength", a fresh perspective. I was a complete outsider to the Simmental world. In fact, I remember typing in the Google search bar: what is a percentage Simmental? In hindsight, this should have panicked me three months before the National Classic. I started from the bottom when it came to the Simmental breed and its membership, but I've learned a lot and seen a lot in twelve short months.

If I could summarize an "outsider's" perspective towards the Simmental breed, the word that comes to mind is progressive. All too often, breed associations can remain stagnant; it's easy to stick with what ya' know. Growing up, we had our junior nationals in the same location for nine years straight and everyone loved it because we knew all the best eating spots in town! But eventually, progress moved the wheel forward to reach new members. It is outstanding to watch the inner-workings of the ASA, from the breed association membership, Board of Trustees and staff, the involvement from all sectors is unprecedented. There seems to be an unspoken truth that in order to flourish, change is inevitable.

The Association itself is proof that strength comes from embracing the ebb-and-flow of the beef cattle industry. When the demand for beef grew, heterosis was a natural solution. While some breed associations balked at admitting two are better than one, the ASA embraced the chance for progress. (I'm really getting this percentage Simmental thing down!) But more than the Association, the members are a testament to the progressive nature of the breed. It takes a lot to know the sires and strengths of your breed, but it takes even more to know the sires and strengths of other breeds for maximum hybrid vigor. It takes know-how to balance all the facts, statistics and common sense to produce a cow herd that works where you work.

Interestingly enough, while the breeders of the ASA remain progressive, their loyalty to the breed is steadfast. At the Denver Foundation Auction, I observed breeders of all types and kinds come together in one room, for one purpose. I watched these breeders of large and small operations, Fullblood and crossbred, college professors and show ring proclaimers throw their hands in the air for a bid on the future of the Simmental breed.

I arrived innocent to the Simmental breed, day by day I become more seasoned into this world. I have tried desperately to not "buy in" to any generic belief. If it was true, I wanted to watch it and believe it for myself. Before I blasted a claim, I wanted to truly believe it before I repeated it. Now that it's been a year, I can state my belief: there is no breed association stronger, more progressive, and more on the cutting edge than that for which I am blessed to be employed. •







Texas Fever Tick Quarantine Expands

Texas and the USDA officials are taking steps to prevent further spread of cattle fever ticks in southeast Texas. At the end of 2016, animal health officials confirmed that fever ticks have spread outside the permanent quarantine area along the Mexican boarder to six areas that are now under quarantine.

Cattle fever transmitted by cattle fever ticks is severe and often fatal. According to the Texas Animal Heath Commission, the tick carries Babesia bovis that attacks and destroys red blood cells, causing acute anemia, high fever, and enlargement of the spleen and liver, ultimately resulting in death for up to 90% of susceptible cattle.

Anthrax in Indiana

The Indiana State Board of Animal Health (BOAH) has issued an advisory saying anthrax has been diagnosed on a southern Indiana beef cattle farm. After a single bull died unexpectedly on the farm, a veterinarian collected tissue samples for laboratory testing. Other animals in the herd have not shown clinical signs.

The infected animal was incinerated on-site and the farm was placed under a 30day quarantine and observation order by the BOAH. Vaccination was advised for all other animals in the herd. The statement said that the situation does not pose a public health threat. Only people who had direct contact with the infected animal are at a risk for infection. •

Organic Handling Rule Goes into Effect

New rules regarding humane handling of organic livestock went into effect Thursday, January 19. The final rule, which amends the Organic Food Production Act of 1990, was cleared by the federal Office of Management and Budget, where it had languished since summer.

The imminent implementation of the Organic Livestock and Poultry Practices Rule drew praise from animal protection and rights groups, and it was met with criticism from the meat industry. The Humane Society of the United States (HSUS) called the rule a "game-changer for the \$40-billion organic market." The National Pork Producers Council called the measure "another 'midnight' regulation" and a "poke in the eye to agriculture."

Livestock Handling Rule Delayed

USDA's Food Safety and Inspection Service (FSIS) said it will delay implementation of a rule designed to hold livestock owners, transporters, and handlers accountable for humane handling of livestock in connection with slaughter at federally inspected establishments.

The rule was to be enforced starting January, but the volume and substance of comments that FSIS received on the rule has prompted FSIS to continue its examination.

USDA Raises Meat Production Forecasts

In the World Agriculture Supply and Demand Estimates (WASDE), the USDA raised its 2016 forecast of total red meat and poultry production, as higher forecast beef production offsets lower poultry and pork production.

Beef production is expected to be lower in 2017; however, reflecting lower expectations for cattle placements in late 2016. The ensuing decline in fed cattle slaughter will be slightly offset by higher expected cow slaughter.

Iowa Beef Checkoff Referendum Passes

Iowa cattle producers voted to reinstate a 50-cent-per-head beef checkoff program following a petition driven by the Iowa Cattlemen's Association. The vote was 56% to 44% in favor of reinstating the assessment. Collection will begin March 1.

The IA checkoff is expected to generate up to \$1.6 million annually, from the state's 27,000 cattle producers. The program is mandatory, but refunds will be available to interested programs. The federal beef checkoff of \$1 per head remains in place and was not affected by the Iowa plan.


Claims Against MARC Refuted

The front page *New York Times* article titled "US Research Lab Lets Livestock Suffer in Quest for Profit," took aim at how animals are treated at the facility, which is exempted from federal animal welfare regulations. OIG examined 33 specific assertions to determine their veracity and discovered that only seven were materially accurate.

Group Sues USDA

The Animal Welfare Institute (AWI) has filed a lawsuit against the USDA for its "unreasonable delay" in responding to an AWI petition, filed May, 2013, to amend the Humane Methods of Slaughter Act (HMSA). Its intent is to prevent incidents of inhumane handling and needless suffering of animals at slaughter.

USDA has not amended the HMSA regulations for the purpose of improving animal handling at slaughter in nearly 40 years, since the original regulations were adopted. AWI's petition requests that the USDA amend the HMSA regulations to address the lack of identified causes of inhumane slaughter.

Restaurant Outlook Looks Grim

The new year is not expected to bring much traffic growth to the US restaurant industry; however, visits to Quick Service Restaurants (QSRs) are expected to increase. Full service restaurants are expect to see a 2% decline in traffic in 2017, which should be offset by the 1% increase for QSRs over the next 12 months.

The food service industry saw flat growth in 2016 and restaurant operators will need to differentiate themselves from the competition in order to potentially alter the current forcast.

HSUS Wins Twice


The Humane Society of the United States (HSUS) scored two big victories over agriculture in the elections. An animal rights ballot initiative in Massachusetts, which was backed by HSUS, passed overwhelmingly, with 78% of the vote.

The new law prohibits Massachusetts's farmers from confining egg-laying hens, breeding pigs and calves raised for veal in small spaces. The other big victory for HSUS was the defeat of a Right to Farm ballot initiative in Oklahoma. It was intended to allow farmers to defend themselves in the face of unjust laws.

College Helps Tribe Build Meat Plant

The University of Arkansas Dale Bumpers College of Agricultral, Food and Life Sciences, and School of Law is helping the Quapaw Tribe design and build a meat processing plant near Miami, OK, to produce and maintain a sustainable local food supply. The \$1 million facility, expected to be operation in May, also will provide the school's students opportunities for training.

The plant is designed to process up to 50 animals per week, and will include a classroom, laboratory, and test kitchen. Bumpers' schools will help with the business structure and regulatory process, while the animal science department will help guide design of the plant.

VA Grass-Fed Beef Processor to Open

Virginia-based, River Ridge Land and Cattle Company has plans to spend \$2.1 million to build a new meat processing plant. The company, specialized in grass-fed beef products, markets through its Grayson Natural Foods brand. The new facility is expected to provide infrastructure for local beef and pork producers.

The facility will cut and package fresh meat for wholesale and retail customers, and offer a variety of custom processing and packaging services.

Shake Shack Chain Growing

Shake Shack Inc., which calls itself a "modern-day roadside burger stand" and is known for all-natural Angus beef burgers, flat-top Vienna beef hot dogs with no antibiotics and no added hormones, and all natural, crate-free chicken raised with no antibiotics.

After opening its first location in New York City in 2004, Shake Shack now has multiple locations in 16 states, the District of Columbia and several international cities.

Washington Moves to Stop Processor

A court order has been issued to stop operations at a meat processing facility in Auburn, WA, that has continued to operate despite losing its license two years ago due to food safety violations. The order requires the owner of Vilog Livestock, to remove all livestock from the property or face fines of \$100 per day for each animal not removed.

The state first cited the processing facility in 2011 for violations that included lacking an approved sewage and waste disposal system, unclean facilities and equipment and unsanitary food processing practices. Vilog Livestock failed every inspection since then, and the Washington State Department of Agriculture revoked the license in 2014.

DOL Sues Processor for Firing Worker


The US Department of Labor (DOL) is suing a West Virginia beef jerky processor for firing a worker because she called 911 to help a co-worker who had severed part of his thumb while operating a band saw. The owner of Lone Star Western Beef Inc. in Fairmont, WV, ordered the employee to hang up her cellphone before responders could answer the call. She was fired two days later.

The owner opted to collect the severed portion of the employee's thumb and told a supervisor to drive him to a hospital, where the doctors were unable to reattach his thumb. The lawsuit seeks back wages and punitive damages.

Orders are being placed online through DoorDash.com or from the DoorDash Android or iOS phone apps. DoorDash will waive delivery fees on Carl's Jr. orders for a limited time. After the promotional period, delivery fees will start at \$3.99.



Oral Salmonella Vaccine Developed

Researchers from the University of Texas Medical Branch (UTMB) have developed a vaccine against salmonella poisoning designed to be taken by mouth. In earlier studies, UTMB researchers had administered the vaccines as injections.

Oral vaccination is the simplest and least invasive way to protect people against the salmonella infection. Taking the vaccine orally also has the added advantage of using the same pathway that salmonella uses to wreak havoc on the digestive system.

Processed Meat Study Discounted

The North American Meat Institute (NAMI) has debunked a French study that claimed a link between cured meats and asthma. The study had concluded that higher cured meat consumption was associated with worsening asthma symptoms over time. Researchers based it on a French Epidemiological study on the Genetics and Environment of Asthma (EGEA) that included 971 participants and found that 20% reported worsening asthma symptoms with cured meats.

NAMI pointed out the dangers in drawing conclusions based on studies that rely on people recalling what they ate and how it made them feel, and the researchers blamed it on nitrates.

Screwworms Reach the Mainland

USDA's Animal and Plant Health Inspection Service (APHIS) has confirmed the presence of the New World screwworm in a stray dog near Homestead, Miami-Dade County, on the Florida mainland. In October 2016, the first infestation in the US in more than 30 years was discovered in Key deer from the National Key Deer Refuge.

According to the latest report from APHIS, eight Key deer have had known infestations, with five confirmed infestations in domestic animals. New World screwworms are fly larvae that can infest livestock and other warm-blooded animals, including people. There have been no livestock or human infestation cases so far.

Ireland Reports BSE Case

Ireland has reported that a deceased cow tested positive for bovine spongiform encephalopathy (BSE). The animal had not entered the food chain, therefore posing no risk to human health nor affecting trade. The animal tested positive for "Atypical BSE", Ireland's agriculture department said, referring to the strain that that has been identified more recently as occurring spontaneously in older animals with a lower incidence rate.

This type is distinct from "Typical BSE", which constituted the majority of widespread cases beginning in the 1980s. There have been 101 "Atypical" cases identified in the EU from 2003 to 2015, compared to 2,999 "Typical" cases. •

The Committee requests that faculty mentors apply for the grant to assist in planning and conducting research, as well as graduate student recruitment and travel.

The Committee will award funds to the top two qualifying programs:

\$5,000 to the top pick and \$3,000 to the second choice.

This grant is available to all agriculture disciplines; however, focus will be on the genetic improvement of livestock.

Entry Deadline: April 15, with announcement by May 15.

To apply for this award:

Faculty members must submit an application explaining the particular area of study and how these funds will be used. The application will include a description of the research, along with supporting documentation from the Department Administration.

This grant will be made payable as a gift to the research account of the selected faculty member.

France Launches Labeling Pilot Program

A two-year mandatory country-of-origin labeling (COOL) program has been launched in France for processed foods containing meat and dairy. Under the program, processed meat labels must indicate the countries of birth, breeding and slaughter. Dairy labels must indicate the countries of origin and processing.

The names of the origin countries may be replaced with the term "Origin: EU" if the animals were born, raised, and slaughtered in one or more EU countries, or "Origin: Outside of EU" if the animals were born, raised, and slaughtered in one or more non-EU countries.

Beef Consumption Projected to 2020

The global market for beef is expected to reach \$2.1 trillion by 2020, according to a new study. Beef is the third-most consumed meat globally, behind pork and poultry. Growing consumer preference for meat as a source of protein is expected to be a major driver of demand for beef over the forecast period.

Growing disposable income in emerging markets has resulted in increased consumption of beef in comparison to pork and poultry. The market is expected to witness significant growth due to food safety issues such as chemical residue and pathogen detection in other meat products. Ground beef is the most-consumed product, with demand exceeding 29.5 million tons in 2013.

World Food Prices Trend Downward

Global food prices fell for the fifth straight year led by declining meat and sugar prices, but commodity markets could face greater volatility in the year ahead, according to the United Nations' Food and Agriculture Organization (FAO).

Meat prices declined 1.1% in month over month and 7% for the full year, mainly due to weakness in international beef and poultry prices. FAO's overall food price index was unchanged and down 1.5% in 2016, marked by a steady decline in cereal prices that offset surges in sugar and vegetable oil.

Halal Unit Incorporated

Global giant Brazil Foods South America (BRF SA) is in the final stages of incorporating the operations of OneFoods based out of Dubai, United Arab Emirates. OneFoods will hold assets related to producing and distributing food products for Muslim markets.

BRF will transfer or license certain brands in permissable markets and will enter agreements with OneFoods under which the costs of certain operational and corporate activities will be shared. The unit aims to serve an estimated market of 1.8 billion people whose economic and demographic growth exceeds the world average. •

FLECKVIEH FORUM

Milestone

It is hard to believe that the 2017 North American International Livestock Exposition (NAILE) will represent the 10th anniversary of the reintroduction of Fullblood Simmentals at that storied venue. That event in 2008 came on the heels of their absence from the scene for many years. Their arrival that year consisted of 18 head of Fullbloods and found our breeders in the ring in competition with the modern day Purebred Simmentals. From my observation, it appeared the judge was a bit puzzled with the appearance of Fullbloods in the mix before him; tough job to sort out such a wide variety of phenotypes; more simply put and a commonly used phrase "like comparing apples to oranges"! Of course, no one is suggesting that apples are superior to oranges or vice versa. I think most people get the point here.

So, what precipitated this reintroduction movement? It started with developments resulting from one of my genetic research missions to Canada in October, 2007. One of my planned stops was the Bar 5 Sale. And, in conjunction with that sale, I attended the annual meeting for the Fullblood Simmental Fleckvieh Federation (FSFF), scheduled for the Friday evening before the sale. This was in Owen Sound, Ontario. I was delighted to see a packed house estimated at over 200 Fullblood breeders and enthusiasts. It may have been the highest attended FSFF meeting ever.



I had no role whatsoever in the evening activities and never dreamed that I would be asked to speak. However, my good friend and



Nolan, had different ideas. Knowing my interest, passion and constant flow of ideas and suggestions for our breed improvement, he shocked me when during the open discussion segment, he invited me to come forward and tell the crowd what I thought about "things". It's hard to turn down a request from such a well respected friend. Unprepared, to say the least, I obliged his offer.

Of the many things I covered that evening, most stemmed from essentially a lifetime of involvement with what I fondly call "traditional Simmentals". Here, I will only cover that which is pertinent to the reintroduction of the Fullbloods to the NAILE stage. I described my history with the NAILE going back to the 1970's, not too long after "traditional" Simmentals arrived in North America from Europe via Canada. For our younger readers of this column, those cattle were not of a black color but very much resembled the Fullblood Simmentals of today. But, gradually over time, there was a shift in our industry dramatically changing the landscape for most beef breeds on this continent. And, unfortunately, this shift affected our "traditionals" as well. They, too, eventually disappeared from the public eye of the many exhibition venues across North America. That had to change, in my opinion, and I duly professed this sentiment to the audience. Further I stated "we cannot expect people to knock down our gates to see our cattle. Rather, we need to take the cattle to them! At next year's NAILE, if there is only one Fullblood Simmental on display there, it will be mine."

Thereafter, I spent considerable time and travel in organizing efforts to get these cattle to Louisville knowing that we would have to compete in the Purebred Simmental Show that first year. Thankfully, a group of breeders, anchored by Bar 5, joined with me and proudly displayed the 18 head referenced in the opening paragraph. Later, with the support and assistance of the ASA and Dr. Lipsey, the NAILE granted our request for a separate show for Fullbloods. The result was the founding of the Pinnacle Show for the 2009 NAILE. Now, like phenotypes, not "apples to oranges", could be fairly and logically compared.

Our NAILE Fullblood shows (now 3) for the 2017 session will, indeed, mark a "milestone" for our breed. During this formative 10 year span, well over 500 Fullblood Simmentals will have been exhibited at the world's largest livestock event. Dozens of our faithful breeders have made this happen and be such a tremendous success. I am deeply appreciative of their sacrifices, dedication and commitment. As a result of that commitment, thousands of people have been able to see and visually appraise these fine "foundation Simmentals" without having to "knock down gates" to do so. Many of those appraisers now have these Fullblood genetics at work in their herds thanks to their reintroduction at the NAILE. Please join us in the Simmental barn in Louisville this November as we pursue another 10 year "milestone".



To help you plan, here are some items which may hold up registration for a length of time:

- 1. DNA / Genetic Abnormalities / Parental Validation / AI Sire / ET Requirements: DNA Testing is a standard process without any options to expedite this service.
 - a. Normal DNA Testing: 3-4 weeks for results.

 Disqualification or resampling will take longer.
 - b. DNA kit paperwork requests: 48-hour turnaround
 - c. DNA kits mailed out daily
 - d. Results uploaded daily as they become available from GeneSeek

2. Non-Compliance:

Total Herd Enrollment breeders: there is a deadline each year where the previous year's calf data or a reason why no calf data was reported must be submitted. You'll be notified of the dams in your herd which need additional information when you go on-line to submit new registrations. Until this information is completed, no new data will be accepted.

3. Foundation Registration:

Sires registered with other breed associations MUST be registered with ASA prior to registering progeny. Other breed dams may be registered with ASA as Foundation, but it is optional, not mandatory. Normal processing 10-12 business days (errorfree, payment received, DNA requirements completed).

4. Breeder Signature:

The owner of the dam at the time of conception is required to sign as breeder. If the applicant and breeder are different, make sure you have breeder's signature on the calf's registration application or breeding information is supplied on the transfer of the dam. If it was sold with calf at side, make sure the seller has registered and transferred the calf to you.

5. Non-payment:

Payment is required to complete registrations.



Priority Handling Processing Service:

ASA offers priority handling services if you are unable to complete your registration online. If the data is error-free and payment is received, normal turn-

around time for registration is within two business days. There is a priority handling processing fee \$50 per animal. Regular US Mail service is at no charge, however, other mailing services (i.e. FedEx, UPS or Express Mail) will incur additional charges.
