



VIEWPOINT

Another junior show season is winding down, other than a few county and state fairs, and school is just around the corner for our youth. I was fortunate enough to attend two of the ASA-sponsored events, the North Central Regional Classic in Fargo, ND, and the AJSA National Classic in Louisville, KY. For Cathy and myself, something was different this year. Our youngest had gradu-

ated out of the junior program last year! All the organization of packing tack, feed, cattle, a week's worth of clothes, and maybe a meal or two and snacks for whoever was around . . . was gone. It was just two old farts and a suitcase heading out to see if we could help or some might say, just get in the way!

First off, thank you to all the host states and organizations for stepping up and hosting the events, I've heard nothing but good from all four regions and the Breeders Sweepstakes group for hosting the AJSA National Classic. Another huge thank you to the AJSA Board of Trustees, there is no free ride here, they are a hard-working board that is extremely active in organizing and making sure all the contests run like a well-oiled machine.

I thought the AJSA Board did an excellent job publishing a piece of literature called "The Survival Guide". They talked about how to prepare for the various contests. They

gave a lot of advice on what to expect, what to bring, even how to dress for each event. It's a must for a first-time family and even a good refresher for a veteran.

Helping judge some of the contests is a real eye-opener as to the future of our youth. We've seen young juniors in sales talk who kick the dirt and can't look the judge in the eye, become an intermediate who will look you in the eye but has a hard time handing you his registration paper because his hands are trembling too much. Then as a senior, they give a sales pitch that could sell ice to an Eskimo. That's what the AJSA program is all about. I had more than a handful of parents tell me "whatever you do, never discontinue the contests that go along with the show and showmanship. They are what makes Simmental different and better than the other junior programs."

The other item I'd like to visit about is the PTP rule guidelines that lowers the percentage allowed to show in PTP shows from 1/2 to 3/8 Simmental. It's probably political suicide to even talk about it, but nobody has ever accused me of being very smart anyways! So here goes. . .

We have gotten a fair amount of feedback from the membership on the rule change. I've heard most of the comments, both in favor of the rule change and not in favor of the 3/8 rule change. If you're one of those that have visited with me personally, you know you're not going to get any argument from me one way or the other. I totally understand both sides of this rule change. I've heard or read several comments about this rule change being a product of self-serving board members getting their agenda pushed through. I was on every conference call and every Board meeting as this agenda item was presented in a subcommittee, then it traveled to the Activities & Events Committee and eventually the full Board. There was a lot of great discussion at each level, at no time did I ever feel it was a personal agenda. It was presented as an idea, like many other resolutions, "what do you guys think", then the discussion began. We have a 17-member board of independent thinkers that represent all the different genetic makeups that make ASA the all-purpose breed we are.

I truly feel when 17 board members sit around a table, the decisions are made with what everyone believes is in the best interest for the future of ASA. Yes, there are differences of opinion, but each trustee represents different geographic areas and a variety of breeding programs and represents what they feel will work in their area. Each trustee is entitled to their opinion and we respect each others' opinions, just like we respect the opinions of the membership. All the emails or letters that I have received have been forwarded to the entire board, if the sender gave me permission to do so. Like someone said, "it's good to know our membership has a pulse and is alive!"

Keep in mind, board meetings are open, and we have a meeting in Denver, CO, during the NWSS, an April meeting in Bozeman, and a fall meeting that travels to different host states. It's a great opportunity to sit in on some working committee meetings and interact with the Board of Trustees.

If you have any thoughts or questions on what's going on at ASA, give your trustee a call. I don't know of any that wouldn't be glad to visit. ◆





immental cattle have long been credited with an impressive ability to adapt hot, cold, dry, wet, or any combination thereof, the breed can thrive. Close to 9,500 miles away in Australia, Hicks Beef is utilizing Simmental genetics to the fullest extent. The family-owned operation takes advantage of ASA's THE Commercial Option, EPDs produced through the IGS Multi-breed Genetic Evaluation, genomic testing, and an overall commitment to the benefit the beef industry can see from data collection and science. Located near Holbrook, on the border between New South Wales and Victoria, the Hicks family runs a 1,250-head Australian Beef Composite (Simmental, Angus, Gelbvieh-cross) herd, and 200 purebred Red Angus females, and supplies around 200 bulls per year to Australian commercial producers.

Committed to Cattle

Andrew Hicks, the founder of Hicks Beef, has been passionate about genetics since he was a young boy. "My father had a small polled Hereford stud, and I just loved pedigrees from an early age. I was given a dairy cow as a kid and I kept the pedigree of every dairy calf from that cow until I was 15. I wanted to get into genetics and pedigrees," he recalls.

This interest combined with a love for agriculture made his decision to be in the beef industry easy. "My love for the farm started with the small farm when we lived on the edge of Melbourne. Since I could walk I wanted to farm, and be a farmer."

Andrew's first introduction to the Simmental breed was in the 1970's. Australia's experience with the breed mirrored that of the US, and despite the added growth of Simmental, many moved on. "I was impressed with the first cross cattle, and then the more it got to purebred, they were bigger leaner cattle that didn't survive in our environment," he says.

However, Andrew kept an open mind and upon seeing much improvement in the breed, decided to give it another try. "Then we got onto the composite thing, saw the improvement in Simmental cattle in the US, and it impressed us enough to go back and give them a go."

Hicks Beef has long been committed to improving their program through science and data. Shortly after the formation of IGS, the program became a part of ASA's THE Commercial By Lilly Platts Option, and today contributes important data and genomic records. Simmental genetics have been an important contribution to the program's seedstock program.

Andrew and his wife, Anne, now run Hicks beef alongside their son and daughter-in-law, Tom and Kate. Tom's involvement with the cattle operation has been paralleled by their utilization of ASA's ability to gather and evaluate data. Around 10 years ago when Tom returned to the farm, they began to fully seek out and utilize the tools available to them. Hicks Beef had always been committed to data, but around this time began gaining access to more powerful avenues for narrowing down their ability to measure progress.

Devoted to Data

The guiding principle of Hicks Beef can be summarized by one word — data. Like any quality seedstock producer, the program takes into account other factors including phenotype. Every year, an independent professional visits the ranch to assess this. Andrew explains, "We cull regularly for feet and temperament. We have someone independent come to the ranch to assess bulls and heifers for their foot score and confirmation."

However, the foundation of their program comes down to numbers. Six years ago, Hicks Beef enrolled in ASA's THE Commercial Option, and began sending the data they were already collecting to the Association. "It's been the biggest change to our program, using ASA's database. We're linked into the genomics, and just such a huge amount of data. It seems to be doing such a good job over multiple breeds. Nothing like that is available over here," Tom explains.

Andrew explains that before utilizing these tools they were forced to use more subjective measures of progress. "We couldn't measure what we were achieving. It's been revolutionary for us to have the likes of the figures behind us to take that next step."

Hicks Beef is a highly committed to using ASA's indexes, especially \$API. As a producer of bulls for commercial operations, they believe that \$API is the most well-rounded tool available across the industry. "What we love about the \$API is it's factors in all of the economically-relevant traits," Tom says.

In addition to the large amount of data submitted to ASA, and their subsequent use of it in their selection process, Hicks Beef also believes in genomic testing. So far, their program has added around 2,500 genotypes to the evaluation, and was a participant in the Cow Herd DNA Roundup project. "It's for the accuracy of data and knowing our cattle. We can take out as much risk for our clients possible. We think it's essential," Andrew explains. (Continued on page 16)

Generating Quality Genetics

A passion for the beef industry, belief in data, and progressive philosophy have combined to make the Hicks Beef program a trusted supplier of commercial bulls in Australia. Annually, they sell around 200 bulls. In Australia, a higher percentage of cattle are finished on grass compared to the US, which necessitates efficiency in Hicks' cow herd. Females and bulls in development are never supplemented with creep feed. All calving takes place on pasture, and overall, the cattle have to take care of themselves. "That's how our customers run them, so we want to run them in the same environment so they are tested in the same way," Tom explains.

High labor costs in Australia are another factor Tom mentions, adding to the need for their cattle to be efficient. "We're very focused on our cost of production. We really try to keep our costs as low as we possibly can."

Efficiency is also a part of daily operations at Hicks Beef. Every animal has an EID tag, and chuteside, these tags are scanned and automatically matched with the weight

taken and additional data recorded. Tom explains that they simply have to transfer this data to the computer which eliminates human error. During preg-checking, females are scanned and by the estimated birth date, the program connects the correct sire by this date. All calves are also parentage tested, which is part of the genomic testing package Hicks Beef utilizes.

Hicks Beef measures their progress by the success of their customers. Andrew and Tom point to a feedlot owner who they have worked with for many years as an example of how they see progress outside their own herd. This customer has seen steady improvement, and his experience is especially important as he follows cattle through their lifetime. Andrew explains, "One of our clients is one of the few guys in Australia who breeds his cattle, feeds his cattle, markets his cattle, and sells them directly to the butcher shop, so he really knows what's happening, and he's one of our good clients. I think it shows that the cattle are performing in the feedlot and cutting up well."

They have also been extremely successful in the Australian Beef Spectacular Feedback Trial. "We are in a steer feedback trial where people from all over southern Australia put their steers all together, they are fed the same at the feedlot, and measured for gain, assessed for their carcass, and we've been winners of that several times," Andrew explains. This past year, Hicks Beef had the third and eighth place pens of composite steers.

Selecting Simmental

The Simmental breed has been a major asset to the Hicks Beef program. Their decision to add Simmental to their program was based on the Meat and Animal Research Center (MARC) data they followed. They decided that Simmental would add value to all aspects of their program after observing the changes in the breed from their first introduction in the 70's. Heterosis is at the center of the program, "We're committed to a threeway cross, Angus, Gelbvieh, Simmental, to maintain a high level of heterosis," Tom explains.

The majority of the Simmental sires used in their program are sourced in the US. Tom explains that also within their own herd and the replacements kept back, most of their Simmental genetics originated in the states. Proving the adaptability and versatility of the breed, Tom mentions several programs they buy semen from and also use management principles from, including Clear Springs, Hook, Gateway, Irvine, and Cow Camp, all of which are located in different areas of the US.

The breed has also fit well into the Australian environment. Hicks Beef is located in a relatively temperate area of the country. While they do get hot weather and can experience drought, Andrew also mentions seeing high mountain snow on different occasions. Most of their cattle stay in the region, and in the extremely arid parts of the country further north, Bos Indicus cattle are required to endure the harsh conditions.

Focused on the Future

Hicks Beef has utilized the Simmental breed to create a sought-after seedstock operation, and following their commitment to improvement, they are constantly looking to new avenues for progress. Carcass data is becoming an increasingly important part of the program, and in the future, Hicks Beef plans to utilize data on all calves that don't make the bull pen. They are also discussing utilizing data from the commercial herd and clients.

Overall, a commitment to their customers and pursuit of tools to improve their operation has allowed Hicks Beef to find solid footing as a seedstock producer in Australia. "We're very appreciative to have been given the chance to use the figures and focus our cattle onto commercial traits." Andrew says. "We want to know accurately what our cattle are doing. To get that extra reliability with genomics, and the most up to date calculations and figures is paramount to us to get things the best for our customers."

Women of ASA

Editor's Note: This is the ninth article in a series highlighting significant contributions of women in the Simmental industry.

The first woman to run one of the oldest and largest cattle farms east of the Mississippi River, Lynda Stuart, is one of many influential women in the Simmental industry.

Lynda Stuart

The belief that every cattleman has an obligation to produce quality beef for the world with a commitment to return more to their industry than just personal profit is the philosophy by which Lynda Stuart lives her life.

Stuart took over the management of the family commercial cattle operation, Stuart Land and Cattle Company, Rosedale, Virginia, when her late husband, Zan, passed away in 2008. Zan managed the farm himself for 58 years and was the direct descendant of William Alexander Stuart — founder of the family cattle business. The couple was the eighth generation to manage one of the largest and oldest operations east of the Mississippi River. Before she retired in 2018, Stuart left the

operation with a legacy for being a science-based, educational, and conservation-focused business.

Born and raised on a dairy farm in California, Stuart spent her childhood assisting her father, Dr. Harold Schmidt, with the office work for his dairy and artificial insemination (AI) company, Genetics, Inc. As a geneticist, her father would consult for dairy and beef operations. "My largest expo-

sure to farm life was traveling with my father. We would go up and down the state and stay with other farm families."

Stuart laughs, "I was kind of a sounding board for my father. He would talk to me about genetics — and I probably didn't understand a lot of what he talked about — but as the AI company and dairy farm progressed, we became a team. I was the implementer and he was the idea man."

In the beginning, Stuart managed the books for her father, but later handled all the promotion and advertising. Her introduction to the Simmental breed came in the late 1960s, when Travers Smith — who successfully imported the first purebred Simmental bull, Parisien, to North America — came to central California to speak at a series of educational meetings sponsored by Genetics, Inc.

Shortly after her father sold his company to Carnation Breeding Services in 1972, Signal, another imported Simmental bull, was purchased by the company and brought to the California facility. Stuart recollects organizing the press party for Signal in Vancouver, Canada, and how imported Fleckvieh-Simmental genetics were used in crossbreeding. "In the beginning, when there were so many beef breeds, everyone was juggling trying to find the right combination for crossbreeding, and my father recognized that Simmental had something special. The people who were working with the Simmental breed were also performance-directed," she says.

The influence of her father shaped Stuart's ranch management style. Her eye for science-based selection decisions didn't change when she took over Stuart Land and Cattle. She continued performance testing through ASA's Carcass Merit Program, a project Zan set in motion, and initiated a few projects of her own. Stuart says, "I implemented genomic DNA testing, I took down some old tobacco barns and fences, and improved pastures to take advantage of water systems installed with federal and state conservation projects. We had the benefit of a strong cattle market so I could do some improvements. I think my impact is greater by keeping my head down, working, and letting the results do the talking."

Stuart is quick to point out that the agricultural industry must always be cognizant of new technology and scientific research. "My husband enjoyed being progressive and so do I. We have the luxury of being unbiased and making selection decisions based on numbers. I talk very strongly about my lofty ideal that we are producing protein for the world. We have a duty to return to the industry more than just our personal profit."

Over her lifetime, Stuart has given back to the agriculture and beef industries through dedicating her time and energy for educational progress. She was involved with the Kellogg Foundation, served on the state 4-H board, advocated for a local high school reinstating vocational agriculture classes, and hosted educational days on the farm.

For the last 25 years, Stuart Land and Cattle has been focused on soil and water conservation by fencing off streams and developing careful drainage systems. Around 45 water tanks and five different wells were installed to provide water for the calves. Stuart shares that not all conservation projects are at the expense of the cattle producer. "Implementing wells and water tanks was very interesting because it was to our advantage to fence off the streams and get more water to areas where we had not previously had water. The cattle gained more ground to graze and we gained another 100 pounds of weaning weights. It was a win-win for us."

As Stuart stepped into retirement in 2018, she received two awards. She was recognized as the 2018 Beef Cattle Producer by the Virginia Livestock Hall of Fame. Her portrait hangs at Virginia Tech, Blacksburg, next to her husband who posthumously received the award in 2017 — the first husband-wife team to be selected. The second award was presented by the Virginia chapter of the Nature Conservancy for "her exemplary demonstration of conservation leadership, her deep commitment of the preservation and stewardship of the Virginia lands, water, and rich agricultural heritage for the Stuart Land and Cattle Company's longstanding partnership with the Nature Conservancy to protect some of the most biologically important forests in

North America."

"Work hard. You can never know too much," Stuart concludes. "You can never have too many resources and extension service people. I may have had lofty goals, but I took baby steps to get there. It's best to have a good sense of humor and the ability to laugh at yourself, your mistakes, and learn from them."








Down to the Genes


Attention Seedstock Producers! It's time to start DNA testing for spring production sales.

As producers across the country start weaning spring-born calves, ASA wants to ensure that any subsequent DNA testing on those calves is successful. With increased value being placed on genomically-enhanced EPDs, it is more important than ever to make sure producers allow adequate time for collecting and organizing samples, requesting paperwork or kits from ASA, testing at the lab, and uploading and analyzing test results. Furthermore, producers should be prepared for scenarios where samples fail or additional testing is needed. Below are the top items to consider for DNA testing this fall.

- On the adjacent page, you will find ASA's DNA-testing time-line. This takes into consideration all of the factors involved with testing. Remember, around 2% of samples will fail for a variety of reasons. Go to simmental.org, scroll down to the Down to the Genes section, and find our top tips for sample collection so you can mitigate the risk of sample failure. The ONLY way ASA can expedite the process is by sending kits to members via overnight shipping, and for members to ship samples overnight to the lab.
- Genomically-enhanced EPDs are not automatic and are generated through a process separate from when ASA's DNA department uploads parentage and trait results. From the time ASA receives results from the lab, it takes on average seven days for the animal's new data to go through the genetic evaluation. This does not guarantee genomically-enhanced EPDs. The IGS Multi-breed Genetic Evaluation analyzes the genotype data and removes genomic files with suspected errors from the genetic evaluation. For example, genotypes are removed if the international ID is incorrect or can't be linked to an animal in the evaluation, the sex isn't correct, the parent or progeny markers don't match (using 50,000 markers), two samples from the same animal have different DNA markers, the markers are out of alignment with expected proportions of heterozygous and
- homozygous calls, or the laboratory had low call rates on the sample. While some of the ID problems can be fixed without a new test, other errors require a new DNA sample and test to be resolved (like samples that fail testing). Members can submit a second sample to retest but there is no guarantee the new sample will be successful. In the event a new sample is recommended for genomic testing, the member is financially responsible for the new test. This does not happen frequently but does mean members should allow adequate time for testing. Animals MUST be on file or registered to run a genomic test.
- ► Sending samples to the lab without paperwork can double the testing time. ASA's lab, GeneSeek, processes thousands of samples per day. If a package arrives with samples lacking either 2D barcodes or paperwork, the lab sets them aside to research, contacts ASA if they can tell the samples are Simmental, and it is left up to staff to figure out who the samples belong to, what testing they want, create an order, and communicate with the lab. When samples have the required 2D stickers or paperwork they quickly go into testing. Additionally, DO NOT send samples to ASA. Either request kits that will be sent with 2D barcodes, or if you have kits on hand, request paperwork so the samples can go straight from you to the lab.

2019 YCC Conference

I was fortunate enough to attend the 2019 Young Cattlemen's Conference (YCC) on behalf of the American Simmental Association. YCC is a tour encompassing every segment of the beef industry over a 10-day period. Sixty young cattlemen and women met in Denver, Colorado, and embarked on our journey.

The first day began in the home office of the National Cattlemen's Beef Association (NCBA) where we became acquainted with NCBA staff and our fellow YCC members. After leaving the plant, we toured Five Rivers' Kuner Feedyard. With a onetime capacity of 100,000 head, the Kuner lot and mill were quite the operation. The sheer size and scope of both the packing facility and feed yard was something that one has to see in person to appreciate. We finished the day with a panel discussion with the JBS executive team. The JBS headquarters in Greeley is an impressive facility and was a great place to discuss some of the hot topics of the beef industry with a group of individuals that most producers wouldn't normally have access to. On our last full day in Denver, we were back at the NCBA headquarters learning about the checkoff and its benefits to us as producers. On our way to the airport, we toured a Safeway grocery store to gain a better understanding of the retail side of the beef business.

All of the stops over the course of the tour were educational and beneficial to anyone involved in the beef business, no matter what facet of the industry. Though we all do things a little differently, everyone shared the same objective of producing the best product that we are able to. Remembering Edmund Tom

September 10, 1935 - May 9, 2019

This Texas breeder was an early advocate and devoted champion for Simbrah.



Edmund Tom, who served as chairman of the American Simmental Association Board of Trustees in 1986, passed away May 9. Edmund was raised in Campbellton, Texas, the son of Ted and Minnie Lee Tom.

After graduating from Pleasanton High School and attending Texas A&M University, Tom accepted a position with the US Department of Agriculture

as a fruit and vegetable inspector, working an area that stretched coast to coast from Southern California through the Rio Grande Valley to the southeastern states.

In 1966, he began his ranching operation, focusing on improving the land and the quality of his cattle. By 1969 he had begun his longtime relationship with Simbrah, breeding his Brahman females to Simmental bulls.

A natural leader, Tom was the first president of the newly organized Atascosa County Cattle Association. Later he was elected president of the Texas Simmental-Simbrah Association and served two three-year terms on the ASA Board.

On the local level, Tom was deeply involved in community activities including Sacred Heart Catholic Church, the Camp-

bellton Community Hall, McCoy Water Board, and nine years on the Pleasanton School Board.

Longtime friend and fellow Texan Fred Schuetze, Granbury, had these comments: "Edmund was among the earliest breeders to combine fullblood Fleckvieh with eared cattle to produce Simbrah and always insisted on using the highest quality genetics he could find.

"Conservation of his land was very important to him for the maintenance of both livestock and wildlife," Schuetze added. "He was one of a kind and he will be missed."

Another fellow Texan and Simbrah breeder, Tim Smith, Giddings, eulogized Tom "as a strong advocate of SimGenetics, who used his talents in leadership to assure a positive future for the American Simmental Association.

"He had the foresight to realize the benefits of crossbreeding *Bos indicus* and *Bos taurus* cattle and the potential that combination had for the commercial cattle industry. He was always willing to share his knowledge and very proud that his legacy would be carried on by his family," Smith said.

Later in life, Edmund and his son, J. Pat, purchased a ranch at Hebbronville, where he spent his last years enjoying the peace and quiet of the ranch, combined with frequent family gatherings, including their 50th wedding anniversary.

He was preceded in death by his son, Bart Andrew; sister, Peggy White; and nephew, James Michael White.

Survivors include Margie, his wife of 53 years; son, J. Pat (Karyn); daughters, Robin Bukowski and Charlotte Tom; and four grandchildren.



ERS, NIFA Will Relocate to Kansas City

US Secretary of Agriculture Sonny Perdue has announced that USDA will relocate the Economic Research Service (ERS) and the National Institute of Food and Agriculture (NIFA) to the Kansas City region.

In addition, USDA said it would not move forward with a plan announced last August to realign ERS under the Office of the Chief Economist. The cost analysis for the ERS and NIFA relocations projected savings of nearly \$300 million over a 15-year lease term.

Cattle Care Audit Launched

Food Safety Net Service Certification and Audit (FSNS C&A) has launched the FSNS C&A Temple Grandin Responsible Cattle Care Program. The program was developed under the guidance of animal care expert Dr. Temple Grandin. Suppliers volunteer to participate in this approach to improving conditions under which cattle are managed.

This system focuses on objective scoring at meat harvesting facilities for indicators of responsible care and management of animals intended for human consumption.

Checkoff Reform Bill Reintroduced

US Senators have reintroduced a bill that would limit and make more transparent the use of federal checkoff dollars. Senators Cory Booker (D-NJ) and Mike Lee (R-Utah) reintroduced the legislation. The same bill, previously co-sponsored by Senators Rand Paul (R-KY) and Elizabeth Warren (D-MA), was excluded from the Farm Bill during 2018.

The senators say contractors are misusing checkoff funds, in some cases, by using fees their constituents pay in to the program to lobby for legislation that might work against their interests.


FDA Backs 'Best if Used By' Dates

FDA is urging the food industry to adopt the phrase "best if used by" for packaged food date labels to reduce consumer confusion and food waste. The agency said confusion over date labeling accounts for about 20% of consumer food waste. USDA's Economic Research Service pegs food waste at the retail and consumer level at 30%, meaning 133 billion pounds of food worth \$161 billion are thrown out each year.

FDA Bolsters Animal Biotech Oversight

The US Food and Drug Administration (FDA) is hiring more scientists to evaluate development of animal biotechnology, over objections from livestock groups like the National Pork Producers Council (NPPC) that are clamoring for USDA jurisdiction over gene-edited animals.

FDA announced the agency's push at the Food and Drug Law Institute's annual conference in Washington DC. NPPC has criticized FDA's management of the technology, saying its regulatory red tape is slowing the pace of its development at the risk of US agriculture's competitiveness in the global market.

USDA Sued Over School Lunch Rules

Two lawsuits have been filed against USDA over its decision to relax some rules on nutritional guidelines in the National School Lunch Program that were put in place during the Obama administration.

The rule, announced last December, relaxes some requirements on milk, whole grains, and sodium in response to challenges schools have faced serving meals that both appeal to students and meet nutritional standards.

USDA Refutes Challenge

USDA has objected and denied allegations made in a lawsuit seeking to stop an agency policy plaintiffs say exempts medium-sized concentrated animal feeding operations from standard government oversight.

Filed late last year in federal district court in Washington DC by Food & Water Watch, the Animal Legal Defense Fund, and several other groups, the lawsuit had been delayed by the federal government shutdown. USDA filed its response to the complaint.

Restaurants See Growth From Millennials

Millennials with children are proving to be a growth segment for the nation's restaurants, especially considering that the entire foodservice industry experienced flat traffic growth in 2018.

A report found that millennial parents increased their restaurant visits by 5% in 2018 compared to 2017, especially at quick service restaurants. Millenials with kids made 7.3 billion quick service restaurant visits last year.

'Natural' Claim Draws Buyers

The "natural" claim on food labels is more likely than other messages to prompt consumers to buy a product, according to a new survey. The survey of 1,000 US adults looked at which loosely-regulated marketing claims on packaging had the most influence on consumer purchasing behavior.

A close second claim to the "natural" claim for motivating consumer purchases was the claim "no preservatives." In the survey, 53% of shoppers said that the natural claim would inspire them to buy, and 51% said no preservatives.

Packers Face Lawsuit Over Pricing

The nation's largest beef processors — targets of a lawsuit alleging antitrust violations in paying US ranchers unlawfully depressed cattle prices — are now the target of a class-action lawsuit accusing the companies of fixing pricing that consumers pay for beef products.

The lawsuit filed in the US District Court of Minnesota accuses Tyson Foods, JBS SA, Cargill, and National Beef Packing of conspiring to charge consumers artificially inflated prices for beef products since 2015. The suit alleges that the companies — which process 80% of the nation's beef products — artificially limited the amount of cattle they purchased, sparking higher retail prices and illegally boosting their profits over the last four years.

Beef Industry Adopts Sustainability

Industry stakeholders have signed on to a plan meant to strengthen the sustainability of US beef through continuous improvement in production, processing, and selling practices.

The US Beef Industry Sustainability Framework is a product of the US Roundtable for Sustainable Beef (USRSB), a multi-stakeholder organization aligning major food and retail companies, cattle producers, veterinarians, scientists, and non-governmental organizations in an effort to better beef industry sustainability and transparency.





Link Between Red Meat, Lower MS Risk

Australian researchers have found there may be a connection between the consumption of unprocessed red meat as part of a regular diet and a lower risk of having a condition that can lead to multiple sclerosis (MS).

Scientists studied subjects who showed signs of central nervous system demyelination which other research says leads to full-blown MS 83% of the time 10 years after diagnoisis. The team discovered that subjects who ate more unprocessed red meat than the group that ate much less were between 37% and 52% less likely to be at risk for MS.

Researchers Uncover Alternative Decontamination

Caprylic acid, a fatty acid found in milk and coconut oil that has antibacterial, antiviral, and antifungal properties, has come out on top in a comparison of four frequently used *E. coli* intervention treatments on beef products, according to a new study.

It has been found to be an effective and viable alternative to conventional interventions frequently used for meat product decontamination. Researchers reported that caprylic acid was the most effective treatment, following by lactic acid and peroxyacetic acid.

Cross-border Bison Meat Recalled

Quebec-based Northfork Bison Distributions has voluntarily recalled an undisclosed amount of bison burgers and ground bison products from the marketplace due to possible *E. coli* O121 and O103 contamination.

The recalled products consisted of ground bison and ground bison patties. According to the company, the products were distributed to institution and retail outlets across the eastern and central US.

Pig Ear Dog Treats Sicken People

In connection with a 33-state outbreak of *Salmonella* illness, the Centers for Disease Control and Prevention (CDC) and the Food and Drug Administration (FDA) have advised not to buy or feed dogs any pig ear dog treats, including any already in homes. The treats could be contaminated with *Salmonella*, and handling the treats could make people sick; eating the treats could make dogs sick. So far, 127 ill people have been reported, including 26 people who have been hospitalized. No deaths have been reported.

Product testing has identified many different strains of Salmonella in pig ears from various brands and suppliers. Information collected to date about where ill people bought pig ears has not identified a single supplier, distributor, or common brand of pig ear treats. •

Tyson Adds Plant-Based Proteins

Tyson Foods, Inc., has announced its first plant-based meat alternative product, additional meat and plant blended products, and a new brand, Raised & Rooted, for its retail line. The initial products under the new Raised & Rooted brand include plant-based nuggets, set to debut in late summer through national retailers, and blended burgers, set to roll out in the fall, which Tyson bills as healthier than competing plant-based-only patties.

In addition, Tyson's existing Aidells brand has launched Aidells Whole Blends sausage and meatballs, made with chicken and plant-based ingredients, the release said.

IKEA Develops 'Meat'balls

Swedish furniture giant IKEA, known for serving Swedish meatballs in its store restaurants, said it is developing a plant-based version to do its part in helping produce the "70% more food that will be needed by 2050 to feed the world's growing population."

IKEA's announcement came as plant-based meat products maker Beyond Meat announced an initial public offering which saw shares of that company skyrocket by 163% on Wall Street and its value reach \$3.8 billion.

FDA Warns IBS

The US Food and Drug Administration has issued a warning to JBS USA urging the company to take corrective actions at a Pennsylvania rendering facility to stop the continued production and sale of beef tallow that is contaminated with pentobarbital.

The letter comes after multiple FDA investigations at the JBS Souderton plant, finding that the facility's operators failed to identify and exclude raw materials and ingredients containing pentobarbital.

Walmart Takes Convenience to New Level

Walmart is preparing to launch a new grocery delivery service that will bring grocery products directly from the store to the refrigerator. The chain's new InHome Delivery service offers delivery to consumer homes by specially trained associates at a time most convenient for the customer.

The Walmart associates gain one-time access to a home or garage through a smart device and they wear cameras that allow homeowners to view the delivery in real time through the internet.

Smithfield Signs Pact with Wind Power Provider



Smithfield is expected to buy 75 megawatts of renewable energy for 12 years from ALLETE Clean Energy, which is building the wind site in Oklahoma. The carbon-free electricity represents more than 15% of Smithfield's overall energy use.

Amazon to Cease Restaurant Delivery

Amazon is shutting down its restaurant delivery service. The service was tested in 2015 in Seattle before expanding to about two dozen cities.

The service had failed to gain traction against competitors that include DoorDash, Grubhub, and Uber Eats. Amazon continues to deliver groceries to Prime members through AmazonFresh and from its Whole Foods supermarket chain.

China Stops All Canadian Meat Imports

China has asked Canada to stop issuing meat export certificates to the country after an investigation into ractopamine findings in a batch of Canadian pork products turned up counterfeit veterinary health certificates, the Chinese embassy said in a statement. The embassy said 188 forged certificates have been discovered. The certificates were sent to Chinese regulatory authorities through Canada's official notification channel, the online statement said.

China announced earlier it would block pork imports from a third Canadian processor after inspectors discovered the banned additive ractopamine in a shipment and promised to inspect all Canadian meat sent to China. Canada's minister of agriculture said the Royal Canadian Mounted Police had been called in to investigate the origins of the shipment that arrived in China with a fake Canadian export certificate because it is a criminal case.

China Stipulates Compliance with Rules

Chinese officials recently hosted representatives from 30 exporting countries, telling them to make sure they get their business in order before sending meat products to China. The highly unusual meeting follows problems that prompted China to suspend all meat imports from Canada.

The top issue discussed was ractopamine, which China prohibits. Ractopamine, a beta-agonist, is a feed additive approved by the US Food and Drug Administration used to enhance lean muscle gain, increase growth rate, and increase feed efficiency.

Canada Addresses Labor Shortage

The Canadian government has launched a three-year immigration pilot program aimed at addressing labor shortages, particularly in meat processing and mushroom production.

The initiative aims to attract and retain workers by providing them with an opportunity to become permanent residents. A maximum of 2,750 principal applicants, plus family members, will be accepted for processing in any given year. This represents about 16,500 new permanent residents in the three-year duration of the program. Temporary foreign workers will be able to apply under the pilot in early 2020.

USTR Hopes for Japan Deal Soon

US Trade Representative Robert Lighthizer told the House Ways and Mean Committee in a recent hearing that he hopes the US and Japan are close to a deal on agriculture tariff cuts.

Resolving the differences over ag tariffs are key to striking a bilateral trade agreement with Japan. The US and Japan had additional trade discussions during the June Group of 20 summit meeting in Osaka.





Chinese Beef and Broccoli

Ingredients:

- 1 pound flank steak sliced into ¼-inch thick strips
- 3 cups small broccoli florets
- ½ cup beef stock
- 5 cloves garlic minced
- 2 tablespoons cornstarch
- 1 tablespoon canola oil

For the sauce:

½ cup low sodium soy sauce
 ½ cup brown sugar
 teaspoons cornstarch

Instructions:

- 1. Toss sliced beef in a large bowl with cornstarch.
- 2. Heat canola oil in a pan over medium heat for a few minutes. Add sliced beef and cook until it browns, a few minutes, stirring frequently. Transfer to a plate and set aside.
- 3. Add broccoli and garlic to the pan, and stir. Add beef broth. Let simmer until the broccoli is tender, about 10 minutes, stirring occasionally.
- While waiting for the broccoli to cook, combine all of the sauce ingredients in a bowl and mix well.
- Add the reserved beef and sauce to the pan, and stir. Let simmer for 5 minutes so the sauce thickens a bit.
- 6. Serve beef and broccoli over cooked white rice. ◆


